## Spring Park Golf Course Results June

This month's blurb was going to be quick and easy. After a victory at Devils Bend and then by playing golf every day last week during my lunch breaks, I had already written up the results for Spring Park. I had mastered the Spring Park layout and I had not shot a score worse than 37 during any of the practice rounds. My confidence was such that I had even checked my place on the leaderboard once the 15 championship were added to my account. As the script was written I was destined to be on 37 championship points and moving on with momentum needed to chase down the leaders on the top by the time we finished at Beacon Hills.

We said last month with reference to Geoff Cooper that you shouldn't count your chickens before they hatch but unfortunately it is a Cooper trait and it gets us in more trouble than Ben Cousins in a Chemist Warehouse half price discount sale. My day started with a topped 3 wood that only just managed to get past the ladies markers and as it turns out that was actually my best shot for the day. Instead of 15 points I only just got one for turning up, were it not for Greg Breasley blowing up the first hole at Spring Park I would have just about ended the day with the pink vest on my home course.

Last month Geoff Cooper enabled us to enter a new word ( to have a "GEOFFERY" (a score of 20 or more) into the Sunday Leave Pass vernacular, however given that in the past 17 years there had never been a need to use the word we thought it was just a triviality and a bit of fun. Who would have thought that just two weeks later it would become almost as regularly used word in our historical archives as having a" Newell."

Greg Breasley has always been a person who has been chasing club records, he was the first member to have a heart attack, he was the first player to have 6 four putts in a single round. Greg was the first person to have a 7 putt and he was even the first person wear the Pink vest 10 times. Big Ball Breasley was obviously disappointed to hear last month in his absence that Geoff had become the first person to hit a score in excess of 20 on a hole. Not to be out done Greg accumulated a "GEOFFREY (score of 20 or more) plus 4" to equal the club record for the most shots on single golf hole and he had done that on the very first hole of the day.

Amazingly the first hole at Spring Park is only 266 meters long so to put it in context the average distance covered per shot to accrue a 24 was 11.08 meters per swat. Admittedly the majority of the damage occurred as Greg bounced from one bunker to the next, time and time again. In fact in hindsight it would have been a smarter move to have putted from the tee to the green and had he done so Greg probably could have had less strokes, although he might have even butchered that up too, especially since he managed to hit the Green for an exact "Geoffrey" but then 4 putted to get himself into the yellow vest with a final score of 24.

The definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over and expecting a different result. So it might be time to call in the shrinks with their straitjackets because Big Ball Breasley must be insane. Greg played the first hole exactly the same way on the second time around. Although he didn't quite score a "Geoffrey" he still managed to hit the ball 15 times, accruing a mind blowing 39 strokes from the first hole alone. With a handicap of 32 there was no way back and not for the first time Greg conceded his demise as yet another Beer Wench title with a Nett Score of 104.

There must have been something about the first hole. It was the thorn in many a player's side. The hole yielded some massive numbers. Following a very promising start, 38 off the stick on the front nine it was looking like back to back victories at Spring Park might be on the cards; however SOS was left calling for help when he suddenly found himself buried in the sand in the bunker on the first/tenth hole. After 6 failed attempts to extract his ball it was looking for certain that another "Geoffrey" was on the agenda, especial when he chipped out backwards and the bladed his next shot deep into the grass tree on the other side of the green. SOS was forced to take an unplayable lie then finally got his ball onto the green to make 1x of his eight 1x putts for the day. Although his Newell plus was not a "Geoffrey" it still crushed his chances of a repeat victory at Spring Park. Steve did however win the putting competition for the day, requiring only 27 strokes with the flat stick during the 18 holes including a chip in gobbler for birdie on the fourth hole.

Twenty seven putts is a very impressive effort by any-ones standards, not even Wayne James could go that low despite the fact that he actually had two chip ins and 6x one putt greens but still finished the day with 30 putts.

While the balls obviously dropped for some of our players there were plenty of others who were left sitting on the fringe. Poor Colin Ewart could not pull a trick. Every putt he struck would stop with in 20mm of the hole. By the end of the day his playing partners were calling him the gynecologist's apprentice because he had spent the entire day, close to the lip and shaving the hole but as much as he wanted to he couldn't drop one into the pleasure zone.

Tom Kellythorn was in the pleasure zone from the moment he woke up in the morning. Evidently, Tom had a dream day. Everything was going perfectly for him. At one stage Tom was holding the longest drive crown, and had his name on three of the four nearest to pin claims. While eventually on the second time round Brad Hughes knocked him off the longest drive with a massive bomb and only one of his NTP's remained unbeaten Tom still had a smile from ear to ear as he carded a career best round of 86 to win the June monthly title.

After nine holes it became pretty obvious Tom that was in a good place, having seen his name scattered across the golf course on all of the NTP's and long drives Tony Mac called out to him "Hey Tom you are on fire buddy, I suppose you are going to tell us you got a bit of action in the boudoir this morning as well." Tom thought for a second as if reliving a golden memory and his smile grew even bigger than the super-coaches ego. It turns out the lucky bugger got to play three holes before he even got out of bed.

The start to the day was not quite as much fun for Big Mick who, although he did get to blow into the bag in the morning did not get as good a reward for his efforts. Mick had had a big session on Saturday at the local footy and the day had turned into night and the night had turned into morning. So by the time he tried to start his car with alcohol interlock device in the morning he was faced with the predicament of not being able to start the car or get to golf. Luckily for Mick Newell was able to swing by and pick him up although not before Mick had thrown up his bourbon laced weetbix on the front lawn and then the big girl was also seen chucking again at the front of the proshop. First time around Vedran had a Newell (score of10) and then the second time down the long par 5 he got caught in the bunker and similar to SOS he took 6 shots to get his ball out of the sand. Although he didn't quite rack up a Geoffrey (score of 20 or more) he did have a very convincing Newell plus.

Vedran three putted his way into the monkey vest and posted his worst score with the club and therefore only managed to just keep his nose in front of Big Ball Breasley and therefore avoid Beer Wenching duties.

It should be noted that Vedran did tie with Stu Coops for second last place who also hacked his way around his home course as if he had never played it before in his life.

Speaking of hacking around the course, we should note and address the issue of the massive divot left in the middle of the golf course. Management were very grateful that the hole had been sanded and filled however they were still concerned about the size and depth of the gauge mark dug into the third fairway on Sunday.

Without making any accusations and not claiming to be Sherlock Holmes but it was pretty easy to work out who the culprit of this trench carved into the grass actually was. Andrew Clarke has finally recovered from his premiership hangover and is starting to show some of the form that won him the big prize last year. His 80 off the stick was almost enough to get a smile out of him but not quite, he does get rewarded with 12 points for coming fourth. Two pars on the first/tenth hole proved Wayne was in good form, he finished inside the top 5.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke so you need to count every shot that you play and you need to finish every hole (even if it takes you 24 shots to do so. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

Once the player's Nett score is calculated they are ranked from lowest score to highest score. (BeerWench) Where more than one player has the same Nett Score then the place allocations are decided based on a countback system.

The count back system is formulated as the following.

\*Total number of stableford points scored on the back nine holes.

\*In the event that both players have the same stableford score on the back nine it then reverts to the number of stableford points scored on the eighteenth hole. If this is the same then it goes to the 17<sup>th</sup> hole, sixteenth hole, fifteenth hole until a players has a better hole and therefore has a higher stableford score than the other.

Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field.

The player in  $1^{st}$  place gets 15 points,  $2^{nd}$  place 14 points,  $3^{rd}$  place 13 points, etc. etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between  $15^{th}$  spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending.

The player with the most points at the end of the year is crowned the Points champion irrespective of how many rounds a person has played. If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in  $2^{nd}$  place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score then that is bad luck to the person in  $2^{nd}$  place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points.
