

Spring Park Golf Course Results April

At just over 2000 meters you would expect the Spring Park golf course to be a walk in the park and an easy scoring opportunity. With four par three's, four par 4's and a soul destroying par 5 it is anything but an easy round as the 19 strong field soon discovered. Narrow greens protected from all sides by bunkers, three strategically placed water hazards and heaps and heaps of gum trees which can easily come into play when any errant shot is hit and the consequences can easily end up costing you 3 or 4 shots.

Such is the caliber of the golf course and the reputation of the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club that we drew an international field this month. Whilst many of the regulars failed to make an appearance Rick Coyte jumped on a plane from the USA to be part of the action. Rick performed admirably under the burden of being partnered up with Mark Sfiligoj alias Supercoach, who spent the entire 18 holes incessantly blabbering away about everything and anything. When Mark wasn't offering unsolicited advice about the things Rick could do to improve his golf score and swing techniques the Supercoach was voicing his opinion on the US global financial crisis, the American housing collapse, the Iraq and Afghanistan war and he even managed to enlighten Rick on the true facts about the Kennedy assassination and the Neil Armstrong moon landing. With all of that verbal diarrhea it was little wonder that Rick's group finished four holes (45 minutes) after the group in front of them had finished their golf and Rick booked the next flight out of the country.

It was just a pity for Rick and all of us that the Supercoach actually managed to find the golf course in the first place. Evidently on his first attempt to find Spring Park he ended up at the Spring Valley golf course instead. The international field also included Colin McGowan who flew over for the morning from New Zealand. Colin had a very good round and showed his natural flare for the game. He played some brilliant approach shots and hit some very powerful and accurate drives. Colin as good as knocked his drive onto the green on the par 4 fourth hole. Whether it was the slope of the green or the guys in the group in front which pushed his ball into the sand trap we will never know, but unfortunately the consequence was, what could have been an easy putt for eagle turned out to be a devastating and uninspiring 6 after he bladed his bunker shot, and three putted the green for double bogey.

On the second hole Colin stood on the tee assessing the difficult tee shot with interest. With a narrow driving area, encroaching trees and a lake to negotiate on the left, he pointed out to a large gum tree. "How far is it

to the green if I hit my 4 iron to about that tree there?" he asked. When he was told he would be left with 100 meters to the green he scratched his head and looked perplexed. "Are you sure it is not further than 100 meters, I don't reckon I could run that distance in 10 seconds" came his reply."

Speed between shots was not an issue for Phil Plane who after his sensational victory at Dorset was gifted with the use of the luxurious Spring Park Golf Course executive golf cart. Fully kitted out with a high performance engine, heated lamb's wool seats, mag wheels and an esky Phil was able to power around the golf course in the Sunday Leave Pass VIP transport vehicle.



Speaking of transport, did anyone see Trevor Adair pay his fine for bringing his partner Kaz to golf on Sunday? Apparently Trevor only just managed to get his leave pass back for the Spring Park Round after he was grounded for the past 2 weeks because he arrived home 12 minutes past his strict curfew time after the Dorset game. Given his inability to adhere to the sanctions inflicted on his social life, Trevor's partner otherwise known as the fun police has taken to dropping Trevor off at the golf course to make sure he utilizes his time allocation effectively.

As he putted for par on the 18th green, Trevor's partner was in the car park, waiting for him with the car running tooting the horn and pointing to her watch. Needless to say the pressure was all too much, he three putted for double bogie and was last seen being dragged by the ear, kicking and screaming back into the car where he was whisked back home without even shouting his playing partners a beer to do his choirs and hard labor for the next four weeks to earn his next 4 hour good behavior pass.

The day didn't start off to well either. Trevor, Luke Chacksfield and Steve Powne all pulled there drives into the safety fence alongside the first tee. Luke was actually 6 over after the first two holes but somehow regained his composure and finished the rest of the day with a blistering round. 2x birdies a nearest to pin, four skins, seven one putts in a row on the back nine and a career best score of 83 off the stick was the dream day for Chackers and he even got to take a couple of dozen left over sausages home for his dog.

Not everyone had such a brilliant day. Tony Grasso Senior was left red faced when he was forced to add an extra shot to his score card when he was caught out having a blatant air swing. Tony's excuse it was just a practice swing didn't cut it and he was forced to contribute his \$2 donation to the fine jar. Rick Coyte went one better, he actually managed to hit the ball while trying to have a practice swing and Adam Cooper had a shot in the bunker that dislodged 3 cubic meters of sand yet left the ball unmoved. In fact Adam actually took so much sand with his first shot that he literally buried his ball and was forced to play his next shot with a shovel. Incredibly he did managed to splash the ball out of the bunker and even managed to hit it on to the green.

Tony MacIsaac would have liked to have used a shovel to bury his head in the sand after he walked off the difficult Par 5 sixth hole for the second time. Having posted his second Newell for the day Tony had amassed a staggering 23 shots during his two encounters with the sixth hole which was devastating considering he was up until the point in career best form. Based on recent performances this year it appears as though his illusive maiden season title is not too far away, let's just hope we can award him a 15 point victory round before he gets to his 100^{th} attempt to win one.

Tony wasn't the only person to struggle on the hardest hole on the course. Stu Coops couldn't do better than a triple bogie on his travels down the hole. Stinky and Steve Powne both had a Newell and a nine for a total of 19, Andrew Clarke blew his chances of winning the days round dumping four shots on what was otherwise a good scoring game. In fact the only person who played the par 5 with any conviction was Michael Collins who set up an easy birdie after a monstrous drive to win the longest drive prize and then a good up and down from the bunker secured him a commendable birdie. Michaels four was easily the best score on the hole and it therefor won him a three hole skins jackpot and the kudos of mastering the hole which devastated all before him.

The Spring Park greens were where the scores were made or broken. Putting was the difference between a good sore and an average score. Luke Chacksfield had the flat stick working a treat; He actual one putted a run of seven greens in a row between the 11th to the 17th greens. With a club record of only 11 putts on the back nine it was little wonder Chackers finished the day in a winning position.

Stu Coops also putted his way out of trouble. Stu has set himself the task of removing Gerard MacIsaac's name from the 2014 putting trophy and to date he is looking as though it may just be possible. Local knowledge helped him to navigate the Spring Park golf course with only 28 putts for the day. Whether Stu is deliberately missing greens to set up a possible one putt opportunities is up for debate but certainly his greens in regulation hit statistics have actually dropped 20% compared to the same time last year.

With all of the good scores taking precedence it was a bad result for the callaway handicappers who for the last few months have always finished well into the top 10. Unfortunately a score of 74 to 76 didn't cut it at Spring Park.

When a player first joins the club they are allocated a handicap using the Callaway scoring system. This is a formula which calculates the player's handicap based on the sum total of their worst (?) holes from the gross score dependent on the gross score achieved. ie) 113 = sum scores of worst 4.5 holes. 9+9+8+8+4=38

With Highway not being allowed out to play this month the scores were all very good. The top 5 players all shot sub-par scores and of course Luke Chacksfields 9 under par 57 is one for the handicappers to look at closely. The Beer wench position was filled with a score of Nett 80 where historically that sort of return would see you inside the top 15 often the top 10 finishing position on the leader board.

With the winter rounds just around the corner the handicapper continues to wield his poison pen this month. A severe administration error has been addressed and Luke Chacksfields handicap has been revised from 26.3 to 15.8. Adam Cooper and John Mea received a trim and for some reason Stu Coops handicap

continues to come down despite some very poor performances of late. Interestingly there were quite a few guys who have been given an upward handicap adjustment. The reason for the dramatic change for Luke's handicap is that he has now played 5 rounds with the social club and he has been switched over to the slope handicap system. Under the slope system Luke's handicap is determined as the best round that he played relative to par x0.93 of the 5 rounds he has played. Therefor the Spring Park round has had a significant impact and has sent him to a whole new world of pain. It won't be until Luke has played about 10 to 12 rounds before the handicap settles itself into a consistent pattern.

SLOPE HANDICAP FORMULA

The following table is used when selecting the best, or lowest, Handicap Differentials. If more than 20 scores have been entered, the 10 best differentials of the 20 most recent scores are used for the calculation.

The USGA does not calculate a handicap until five scores have been recorded.

The changes to player's handicaps are as follows:

BOLD RED NUMBERS- refer to players whose handicap has gone out
BOLD GREEN NUMBERS- refer to players whose handicap has come in
BOLD BLACK NUMBERS- refer to players whose handicap has remained unchanged
NON BOLD NUMBERS- refer to players who didn't play this month so handicap has not changed
