As we gear up for 2006 season it is reassuring to know that most regular players now have an official Sunday leave pass handicap. If a new member joins the club, initially they play using the callaway scoring system until they have completed 3 full rounds. Handicaps are then adjusted on a monthly basis according to each players performance. Please note that we are using the exact format for handicapping that is used by the VGA and Golf Clubs around Australia.

There were some significant changes to a few players handicaps throughout the course of the season which should make the competition tougher next year. The most noteworthy changes were Fitzy who started on a handicap of 23.1 and starts in January playing off 19.6. Bocca dropped his from 32.1 to 28.1 and Lukey Dumbrell shed 2.7 shots from his handicap in Dec 2004 of 32.1 to be playing off 29.4. On the other side of the scale, the handicapper himself, Jamie Brunton has managed to get worse each month and his handicap has gone from 28.2 to 28.7 in the last 12 months.
