The day started in magnificent style with all 4x members of the first group belting their drives long and straight down the middle of the fairway. It was a matter of anything you can do I can do better, and it culminated with Mick Harper needing to drive at least 270 meters to be in poll position off the tee. As Mick uncoiled his back swing there was an almighty Thwack that echoed around the Warburton Valley, simultaneously 16 jaws dropped to the ground and 32 sets of eyes popped out of their sockets when he smacked the ball 311 meters and his ball came to rest sitting on the fringe of the 1st green. Although he just missed the putt for eagle, it was his tap in Birdie that started the positive vibe for the day.

Mick made the Warburton golf course look like a pitch and putt venue, he smashed his way to a very respectable score including another, 2x Putt birdie on the 10th hole after he nudged his three wood on to the heart of the green.

Last months victor was not to be out shone, after watching the power hitting of his playing partner on the tenth hole, Gerard went one better. He played possibly the shot of the day, knocking his drive within a foot of the flag setting up the easiest of eagles. Although it can not be proven, it is believed, that based on where the plug mark for his ball was and where it finished up, the drive may have actually hit the flag and bounced backwards. Gerard's shot incredibly close to an Albatross, Hole in one. Gerard once again posted a wonderful score and his rapidly descending handicap is having little effect on his monthly place rankings.

After this months performance Geoff would be starting to get a bit nervous. No doubt he will be consulting his insurance brokers to ensure he is covered for what he initially that was thought to be the impossible but is now turning out to be the inevitable.

Gerard's near grand slam was only bettered by Steve Powne who shot the lights out on all of the Par 3 holes around the Warburton track. In fact Steve had his name on three of the first 4x Par 3 holes on the Nearest to Pin markers. Steve's ball was like a flag seeking missile as he zeroed in on the hole and his shot's got progressively closer and closer. On the 12th hole Steve came within 3inches of the ultimate result, when he caressed a perfectly struck five iron to within a putter head from winning the hole in one prize. His tap in birdie was by far the closest any one has come to holing out for an ace in a Sunday Leave Pass competition. It was a brilliant shot and gave Steve his only chance to 1 putt giving him a memorable birdie on a day when his stroke play was magnificent but the putter let him down.

Peter BenNettt rolled in a monster 12 meter bending putt on the undulating 11th hole to secure a great birdie. Peter has had his clubs in mothballs for more than two years since he had a surgery on his shoulder however he was striking the ball like he had just got off the US PGA tour. Peter was hitting his 5 iron off the tee further than his playing partners were belting their drivers and his ball very rarely found it self in any trouble. Despite his time away from the game and astoundingly even with a frustrating total of 44 putts Peter still managed to hit a blistering 89 off the stick giving him a Nettt 66.

Al Bayer, as he always does played like he had his ball on a string; he was shaping the ball from the left to the right, or from right to left as the course required at will. Al played the first three holes on the back nine one under par and apparently some of his massive drives actually registered and were identified as UFO's by the Parkes space tracking centre. Al was hitting the ball so cleanly that it times he found it difficult to control the spin he was imparting on his ball. On the 18th the ball his 8 iron approach which pitched at the back of the green, spun all of the way to the front of the green which must have been at least 15 meters of spin. Unbelievable!

It was great to see Lukey Dumbrell get his name up in lights this month, he claimed the nearest to pin prizes on the 3rd and 9th holes out gunning Steve Powne with some magnificent golf shots. Congratulations also to Tony MacIssac who managed to win his first ever longest drive prize on the par 5, 5th hole. Not to take anything away from Tony, as I believe it was a very good drive, however it should be said that after 13 of the 17 players in the field, the longest drive marker was still sitting on the tee since no one had actually managed to hit the fairway yet.

Any longest drive prize these days is a real feat in itself since you have to overcome the power and accurate hitting of Mick Harper, Al Bayer, Gerard and Big ball Breasley just to have a chance. Tony played the 15th hole brilliantly, after his long drive he then smashed his ball with in pitching distance of

the green, he then chipped on to the putting surface and gave himself a genuine opportunity to make birdie on the difficult par 5 hole. Unfortunately the adrenalin surging through his veins from the perfectly played hole reached boiling point and he over cooked his putt and sent his ball rolling past the hole and into the rough at the side of the green. He still managed to chip up and down and made a very solid 6.

It was a relatively small turn out this month, so hopefully we get a better turn out next month at Yarrambat. The field was reduced even more when the Super coach checked the Google maps over the Warburton Valley and thought he saw smoke. The threat of bushfire was too much for him and he cancelled at the last minute although it was latter discovered that the plumes hanging over the mountains were nothing but low lying clouds and not the catastrophic bushfire he thought it was.

Brother, Chris was another missing person this month, Chris was unable to drive to the course because he has recently lost his license for 3 months and despite his best efforts to hitch hike to Warburton (would you pick him up if you saw him on the side of the road) he had to succumb to the reality that he was destined to spend his Sunday afternoon with the wife and kids. By 2-00pm in the afternoon he had vowed never to do anything stupid in the car again and the penalty of being house bound with the Sfiligoj family far outweighed the demerit points or \$500 fine the police had slapped on him.

Congratulations to Neil Phillips who played a solid round to claim his first victory with the Social Club. A great round finishing with a Nett 65 was more than enough to secure his win. Peter Bennett having been put back together by the best surgeon in Australia has come back into the game with a vengeance. He struggled with the putter but still scraped together a second place finish with a Nett 66. Mike Harper as can be expected left everyone scratching their heads, if you had never seen him play golf you wouldn't think it could be possible to strike the ball as strongly as what Mick does. Gerard secured his place at the top of the Championship leaderboard with the equal lowest round for the day. Lukey Dumbrell finished in 5th spot taking with him two Nearest to pin prizes along the way.
