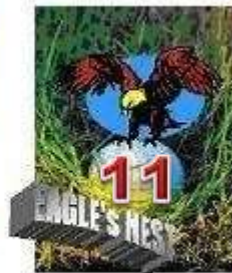

Anyone who finds it too difficult to make the EFT transfer on time is welcome to make a larger transfer and keep some money in credit for when they fail to make the payments on time.

Warburton Golf Course Results

February

Anyone who says that they don't like the Warburton Golf Course must have rocks in their head. Warby is a beautiful golf track set amongst a magnificent scenic mountainous backdrop. The course itself offers the opportunity to build a very respectable score so long as you keep your ball out of the meandering creek and away from the rough and 250 to 300 year old trees with a 4 meter girth.

There were quite a few guys who posted good scores this month, even "Highway man" (Newell) broke 100 for the first time. Don't get too excited though he broke 100 Nett not Gross, but 99 Nett, 136 off the stick was a career best round for Newell and was proof that his two golf lessons and the 600 golf balls he hit at the driving range last week was money well spent even if he did finish in the pink dress beer wench position yet again.

The handicapper has had a busy time of it over the last 24 hours. He has taken 4.9 shots away from the top end of the leaderboard with Stu Coops copping the biggest hit losing 1.1 shots from his handicap after just one lucky round where he kept the ball close to the fairway and the putter saved him on numerous occasions.

This month all of the players inside the top 12 shot 72 or better. After years of domination from the MacIsaac family with Gerard & Matt featuring regularly in the monthly titles, and of more recent times it has been the Grasso family have also had a good share of the successes. So it was nice to see that this month a new family have risen to the top.

The monthly title at Warby was decided on count-back between Geoff Cooper and his son Stuart. Both Stuart and Geoff shot the same score Nett 65, however Geoff racked up 22 stableford points on the back nine whereas Stu was only good enough to accumulate 21. Warburton is actually Geoff's first monthly title and his round of 99 was his career best score with the social club so he deserves the win even if it does come at my expense.

The guy I feel most for is Tony MacIsaac who after 70 rounds (7695 shots at an average of 109.93) is still left chasing an elusive monthly title. With an equal career best score 95 (he also scored 95 at Warburton in 2009) Tony had a short moment of excitement and was experiencing heart palpitations when it looked as though his score of Nett 67 might be good enough to win the round. Unfortunately it wasn't to be the fairy tale ending for him and Tony was at the last minute relegated to fourth spot as some other good scores came in from the back of the field.

At the other end of the spectrum, Gerard MacIsaac had a very uncharacteristic afternoon. Gerard posted a very poor score by his terms (89 Nett 79). The usually consistent Gerard not only failed to get his name into the top ten which is a very rare phenomenon but he actually finished in 22nd place out of a field of 24 players. That is as close to beer wench as he has ever been, it was just a pity he didn't finish in outright last place since the Beer Wench trophy is the only Sunday Leave Pass prize that is yet to have the name Gerard MacIsaac engraved onto it. Such was the day for Gerard, that even his trusty Texas wedge failed to perform for him. Gerard never came to terms with the speed and undulations of the Warburton Greens and had a total of 36 putts the round including a four putt and three 3x putts. To some of us that would sound like a normal day on the golf course but for Gerard who averages just under 32 putts per round it was almost a wrist slashing catastrophe.

His only consolation is that he wasn't the worst player with the flat stick. Newell Richards and Mitch Jansen racked up 47 putts each, and Rick had 46 putts for his 18 hole adventure. When you put this number of putts into perspective it means these guys were three putting at least every second hole during the entire game of golf. Needless to say when you have a lot of putts you are destined to finish at the back of the end of the points leaderboard which each of these guys did.

On the other hand, Stu Coops had a day out with the putter, he had a run of 7 one putt greens in a row and finished his round without a three putt green and posted a very impressive total of only 28 putts for the day.



It wasn't plane sailing for Stu all day however. On the 6th hole he nearly ended his day early and could easily have been forced to retire hurt when he tried to jump across the stepping stones to traverse the Ythan Creek to pass the car keys to the lead group so they could prepare the BBQ.

Ignoring the advice from the Supercoach (who naturally had some better advice on how to cross a river), Stu bounded from rock to rock. As his rubber shoes hit the last moss covered slippery boulder there was a crash and a splash as Stu disappeared into the icy cold brook. He gingerly appeared on the other side with bruised ribs, a grazed elbow, water dripping out of his shoes and blood spurting out of a gash in his right hand where he had impaled himself with the car keys.

Sam Creaton broke the century barrier to elevate himself into 5th position and in the absence of his good mate Shano, SOS was able to post a respectable score and finished in equal 6th spot with Steve Powne.

Matt MacIsaac played well enough for a top 10 finish as did the power hitter Brett Meyer who actually hit his drive 70 meters through the back of the green on the par 4 tenth hole. Brett looks as though he should start with the club next year month with a single figure handicap and has his sights set on deleting Big Micks name from the longest drive profile in the immediate future and is also aspiring to be the lowest handicap marker amongst the playing group.

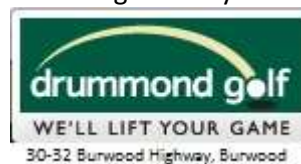
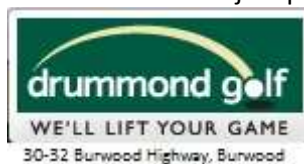
