Warburton Golf Course Results

February

The beautiful Warburton golf course lived up to its reputation of producing some good golf scores. As temperature rose as the day went on so did the quality of golf. There were birdies a plenty. As a group we accumulated a Sunday Leave Pass club record of 65 pars 17 birdies and an eagle. Some might argue that the course was too easy especially when you consider that Tony MacIsaac had a birdie and even highway (Newell) had a birdie putt. However the greens were very testy and an errant shot from the tee often led to disaster.

Congratulations to Ron Parsons who is showing a rapid improvement in his golfing prowess, ever since he retired towards the end of last year Ron's game has been getting better and better. Having lived on the back of Chirnside Park Golf Course for the previous 40 years Ron is actually starting to wonder whether he might have made it as a pro had he spent his time out on the golf course in his backyard practicing rather than slaving over the tools working for the man for 45 years.

Ron was the standout winner at Warburton with a score of 93 Nett 61 which was 8 under his handicap. Ron has moved to equal leader on the points championship leaderboard and was very quick to pay his \$50 deposit to secure his spot on the 2015 golf trip to Rich River.

Sharing the number one position of the points leaderboard on 27 points is Dale Robinson who is carrying into the 2015 season, the same form that enabled him to win the 2011 title with a Sunday Leave Pass record score of 126 points. Dale looks like he will be a hard man to beat this year and he was even able to hold his own whilst paired up against Big Mick.

Dale smashed out a 305 meter drive on the par 5 fourteenth hole to set himself up with an easy Par. Big Mick also managed to launch a long drive down the same hole but was only 17meters further down the fairway than Dale. When quizzed about why he claims himself to be a big hitter when he was only able to hit the ball 5% further than Dale despite him being twice as tall, and twice as heavy, Mick came up with every excuse in the book. According to Mick the wind was trailing for Dale but turned around to be a head wind for him. One excuse he used was that his ball must have hit the buggy from the group in front and he even had the audacity to allege that the group must have thrown his ball back up along the fairway because they were jealous of his length.

The reality is that the gap between Micks golfing ability and the rest of the Sunday Leave pass crew has been bridged. As Mick blows out to his now double figure handicap the rest of us are getting better and our handicaps are coming down while his continues to go up. Gerard has claimed the Sunday Leave Pass No# 1 golfers status but only so long as guys like Brendan Waters and Brett Meyer remain only casual visitors of the club.

Any doubt whether or not Mick should be a worthy candidate for the least improved player title in 2015 was waived when he was sighted wearing the three putt monkey vest on numerous occasions.



While you are pondering your votes for 2015 you might want to elevate Big Mick higher on you radar for the leather wedge prize.

Apparently Mick also managed to have an air swing on the 7th hole but forgot to record it as a stroke on his score card, according to his playing partners the big fella had a swipe at the ball on the 7th hole but the ball only moved an inch. Evidently to cover up his demise he quickly had three of four more practice swings before readdressing the ball and making another shot.

When queried on why he didn't pay his fine for the air swing Mick claimed that it wasn't a shot it was just a practice swing and he accidentally nicked the ball.

As Micks game deteriorates it's a good sign for the rest of us. Highway (Newell) is investing heavily into his game and has aspirations to be mentoring Big Mick by the end of 2016 rather than it be the usual other way round. Who knows it might just be possible. With regular weekly visits to the Pro's at Morack, Amazing Golf, Wattle Park, and GolfTec it could be said that **Newell has more Pro's at his disposal than Ashley Maddison**. The lessons seem to be working, Highways score improved by 27 shots compared to his round last month at Waterford Valley and his visit to Warburton this year (with a score of 114) was 22 shots

better than when he played the course the same time last year. Were it not for a 12 on the 8th hole and a 10 down the dreaded 18th hole he would have been knocking at the door of a sub 100 round.

REMINDER HOW 3 PUTT MONKEY GAME WORKS



*As part of the putting competition this year, as a brainchild suggestion from Paul Blizzard we have introduced the Three Putt Monkey game. At the start of each round every group will be given a fluoro yellow 3 Putt Monkey vest and whenever a person has a **3 putt or worse** that player must put on the 3 Putt Monkey Vest and wear it until another player in the group has a **3 putt or more**. The player wearing the 3 putt Monkey vest at the completion of the 18th hole will be required to chip in an additional \$2 into the fine jar. If multiple players have a **3 putt or worse** the player who was last into the hole wins the vest irrespective of whether the other player before them had a 3 putt, four putt or even a seven putt. The furthest player from the hole should putt first and that player is deemed as in control and therefore has the option of marking their ball if they miss the putt or putting out.

SOS ended up wearing the monkey vest at the end of the 8th hole after making a 3 putt par from less than 12 feet. SOS played a brilliant 4 iron onto the green having hit up on the group in front of him. With a 12 foot eagle putt within his grasp SOS made the fateful mistake of asking what the eagles nest prize pool was worth. Needless to say he missed the eagle, failed to make a Birdie and tapped in for a devastating par and his reward was the burden of an extra layer of clothing on a 36 degree day.

There were a few other attempts for eagle that went unrewarded, Stu Coops also missed an eagle putt on the 8th hole, Mick Harper lipped out for eagle on the 8th hole and he also had a near miss on the 14th hole but the eagles nest did end up going off but it wasn't on a par 5 but rather on the par 4 eleventh hole.

Steve Powne introduced a new member to the club in February. Steve described Brendan Waters as an occasional golfer who plays at a similar standard and skill set as himself. I cannot ever remember Stevie Powne shooting 5 birdies and an eagle a single round which is just what Brendan did on his way to the day's lowest score, a very impressive 3 over par 72. Brendan becomes the first ever player in the Sunday Leave Pass social club to be given a Callaway handicap of scratch so how Steve likens his game to Brendan's is yet to be explained.

Brendan started the day with a perfect drive down the middle of the fairway followed by a small pitch into the green which lipped out for eagle but it made for the easiest of tap in birdies. After a couple of easy pars he also made a birdie after hitting an 8 iron next to the flag on the fourth hole and then chipped in for birdie two on the Par 3 fifth. By that stage at 3 under par it was pretty obvious that Steve Powne had brought along a shark with him and they were obviously conspiring to take advantage of the social club. On the 285metre 11th Hole Brendan hit his drive through the back of the green and was faced with a chip back down the hill which even Adam Scott would have deemed as near impossible. Brendan chipped the ball into the hole for an eagle 2. Later in the afternoon he was seen in the carpark passing on half of the 12 golf balls that he had won in the eagles nest prize pool to Steve Powne who had a sheepish smile on his face.

Brendan must have been disappointed that even with 5 birdies and an eagle for the day he was still not able to win many skins in the 18 hole skins competition, luckily for the rest of us the handicapper put Brendan off a zero Callaway handicap and not on 22 as Stevie P had suggested initially.

Tony MacIsaac proved yet again that the Warburton golf course is a happy hunting ground for him. Tony has twice previously been runner up at Warburton and has had his two best ever rounds on the mountain course. This year he had his victory speech written in advance and he even had arranged for his best mate Rob Underwood to drive down to Melbourne to join him for a round of golf and his victory party. Unfortunately Rob was unable to make the 5 hour drive and Tony was left to go commando. (Play without undies.) Standing on the 16th tee it was starting to look as though T Mac was going to break the drought and claim a monthly title. He had yet another good score going on the Warburton layout and was looking like he could finally win that illusive maiden Sunday Leave Pass monthly title. Were it not for him finishing with a quadruple bogie on 16, a triple bogie on 17 and a nine on the last hole Tony might just about have finished in the number one top position but he did choke and with every stuffed up shot he fell further down the order of merit rankings and in the end he was lucky to scrape in for 14th position and was able to claim 2 championship points instead of the 15 that he was on track to win.

Congratulations to Ron Parson who is definitely showing signs of a very successful campaign in the 2015 season. After a brilliant end to last year Ron has continued with his new found form and once again finished his round in top position with an impressive Nett 61. Dale Robinson was a close runner up with Nett 65 beating Andrew Pugh on a countback. SOS and Adam Cooper rounded out the top 5 with Sub par rounds and they therefore finished in 4th and 5th place respectively. All of the players in the top 12 scored Nett 72 or better and it was really only slinky and the soon to be Beer Wench Colin Ewart who struggled to make a score on the Warbuton layout. Both of these boys failed to score better than a Nett Score in the 80's which interestingly still would have landed them a top 10 finish at Waterford Valley. We will look forward to seeing Colin wearing the Pink Beer Wench Vest at Dorset next month as the new rules of the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club are such, that the player who comes last each month must wear the pink vest for the next round.
