## Waterford Valley Golf Course Results January

With only 13 players attending the Waterford Valley round and of those only 12 completed the entire round so it doesn't really leave me much to write about in the blurb. I will therefore keep the results nice and brief for you all.

Congratulations to Glenn Douglas who claimed perhaps the first of many monthly titles with the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club. Glenn has come from the Mark Sfiligoj and Trevor Adair school of golf and has managed to manipulate his handicap to be very generous considering his ball striking ability. Glenn hits the ball with the power of Big Mick and Gerard but has the finesse around the greens like Gerard and Dale. With a handicap of 19 he is going to be a regular dominant feature at the top of the leader board and could be the early odds on favorite for the 2015 points championship trophy.

Big Mick closed out the day with an impressive score of 3 over on the back nine. Conditions became progressively worse on the back nine as the wind picked up, but while others struggled to keep their scores together Mick put on a brilliant display of golf better suited to a single handicapper, not a double figure handicapper like Mick.

To put the scores in perspective, on the same 9 holes Mick had 39 strokes, Greg Breasley had 70 and Newell had a mind numbing 77 shots on the back nine. The difference between a bad round and a disastrous round for Newell was the 18<sup>th</sup> hole when he racked up a bunker to bunker pattern which resulted in him writing a score of 17 on his scorecard. So devastated was Newell with his score that he claimed he was serious contemplating giving the game away. Glen was quick to let Newell know "Mate watching you go back and forward from one bunker to another for 10 minutes was enough to make me want to give up golf altogether myself."

It was a commendable effort for Glenn to keep his composure and build a good score while partnered him with Newell who over the course of the day wore the Three Putt monkey for 16 of the 18 holes played, he actually had a 5 putt, had 2x 9's a twelve, a thirteen and a seventeen on the last hole. Other than that he played OK, in fact despite posting a score of 141 Nett 104 he was one of only two players who actually had his handicap come down this month.

Greg Breasley didn't fare much better. When his drive on the ninth hole failed to get past the ladies tees he was told that he could have a freebie, this was not an act of generosity but rather because Greg had already maxed out his fine jar liability, as had his playing partner Supercoach.

The day didn't get any better for big Ball Breasley on the pack nine. He card a 2 under par 70 on the back including an 11 on the par 3 thirteenth hole after hitting 3 balls in a row into the drink and playing 7 off the tee. Greg wasn't the only one to put balls in

the dam on 13. In fact by the time the SLP field had passed the hole the water levels had actually risen by about four inches and the course was on flood alert.

Ron Parson was one of the only guys, who's golf ball didn't end up in the water. Ron's ball did hit the water it just didn't end up in the water. After watching Greg Breasley hit three balls in a row into the dam, Stu Coops hit 2 balls into the water and after seeing the Supercoach throw a tantrum after losing his Topflight 7 to the depths of the Waterford Valley Bermuda Triangle. It was Rons turn, he stood on the tee more than a little nervous, he had already seen 6 balls from his playing partners disappear from sight. He opted to take the every reliable (trusty) driver to try to carry the large watery expanse. Ron caught his drive thin and the ball skimmed five bounces across the water surface, then mounted the bank on the other side, hit a duck and finished up in the middle of the fairway. Ron finished the hole with a five whereas his fellow golfer couldn't claim anything better than an 8.

The second ball Stu Coops' hit into the dam on the 13<sup>th</sup> hole landed semi submerged in the water just off the bank. Never one to pass up on a challenge Stu decided rather than to take the safe option and take a penalty drop, he thought it would be better to try to play the ball out of the water and save himself a stroke. As he stood ankle deep in the water the waves crashed over his ball and it was actually moving from side to side as he took a swat at it. Incredibly he actually manage to pick the ball up cleanly, it flew up and out of the water and flew some 90 meters before falling short of the green and rolling back into the water yet again.

This year we have introduced a new game into the mix. As part of the putting competition we have a fluorescent yellow vest for every group and this vest is to be worn by the last person to have a three putt or more. Once a player has a three putt the only way they get to take the vest off is for another player in their group to have a three putt or worse. This game brought some friendly banter and competition within the group and it was always interesting to look down to the surrounding fairways to see who was wearing the Three Putt Monkey Vest. The player who is left wearing the yellow vest at the completion of the 18<sup>th</sup> hole is crowned the monkey and they must add a \$2 fine to the fine jar.

It took Newell Richards 15 holes to get the monkey off his back and by the end of the 17<sup>th</sup> hole he had it back on again. Greg Breasley had three 3x putts but only had to wear the vest once because on his first 2 occasions someone else three putted on the same hole. Greg was wearing the Monkey vest when he putted out on the 18<sup>th</sup> hole, but Ron Parsons followed him in with a three putt and was left carrying the title.

Yellow obviously isn't Dale Robinsons color because he never even looked like having a 3 putt. Dale had a career best round with the flat stick. He had 10 one putts and 8x 2 putt greens finishing the day with a very impressive 26 putts. When you putt well you generally score well so it was little surprise that Dale finished at the high end of the leader board. He finished the day in third place with Nett 76, missing 2<sup>nd</sup> spot on a countback to Nick Harper.

After 3rd position the scores are hardly worth mentioning, so we won't. Hopefully the rolling hills and tight fairways of Warburton are better to us than the flat open space and Waterford Valley.
