Werribee Park Golf Course Results August

Hey Stu,

Seeing as how I must be an absolute lock for the pink vest after yesterday's effort I thought I would take a minute to share some of the details of my splendid adventure.

The lowlights included a detailed exploration of all three bunkers on one of the par 3s on the back nine where, after driving to about 30m from the green on the left, I chipped into (rather than over) the bunker that was between my ball and the green. From there I eventually chipped on and then rolled off into a second bunker and then on and over into the third.

On the 18th I smashed my drive downwind and then played, once again, to about 30m from the green and had a bunker negotiate over to hit the green. seven shots and several bunkers later I finally popped out of the sand and my ball was a few inches from the top of a bunker a couple of metres from the green. From here my putt travelled like a laser for 15ft straight into the hole for a rare 10-0 for the hole.

On the other side of the ledger on the 11th hole with a viscous cross-wind I duffed and shanked a couple of attempted approach shots before popping up a ripper from 40m that rolled into the stick and dropped into the hole for a 7-0.

Incredibly with two chip ins for the day, one could imagine what score Barry could have had if luck hadn't brought good fortune on him on the way.

Cameron Ross and Col Ewart also had gobblers when they chipped in from off the green. Big Mick nearly holed out his 7 iron from 168 meters out on the Par 5 ninth hole. Mick unleashed a monstrous drive to claim the Long Drive title by at least 60 meters. He was left with a 7 iron into the green having launched the ball 315 meters with the driver. His next shot flew straight at the flag pitched within a meter of the hole and rolled up the hill a little giving him a medium length down hill putt to claim his 4th eagle for the social club. It wasn't to be, although his tap in birdie was a remarkable effort on a perfectly played hole. The eagles nest continues to Jackpot with 22 balls in the kitty for the next person to make an eagle.



Hopefully the next eagle comes in the form of a Hole in One. I had a premonition on Sunday that someone was going to hole out on the 17th green.

As I walked off the green there was a beautiful rainbow which ended directly at the top of the flag stick, so I thought it was a sign that one of you golfers was going to get the pot of gold on the par 3 seventeenth hole.

Unfortunately, it wasn't to be, in fact no one else even hit the green, so perhaps the pot of gold was actually me winning the nearest to pin prize.



It was nearly a great day for me because not only did I win the NTP on the 17th hole, but I also came within a whisker of going back to back and winning the July and August monthly titles. Despite playing in the tougher conditions having hit off in the darkness when the temperature was close to zero degrees and the rain storms and wind was at it's worst while the rest of you were still in the warmth of your bed, I still managed to put a reasonable round together. Unfortunately, a couple of lost balls on the 18th hole cost me the title on a count back to the eventual winner. Although I didn't win, it was great to see a fan favorite get the chocolates at Werribee Park.

Congratulations to Rick Turcinovic who played a sensational round to finish the day with Nett 75 to claim his fourth Sunday Leave Pass title and his first since July 2015. Rick finished the round with 19-stableford points on the back 9 holes which rewarded him with the coveted Sunday Leave Pass monthly title on a countback beating Stu Coops and then Mal Griffiths who 4-putted his way out of the equation on the very last hole.

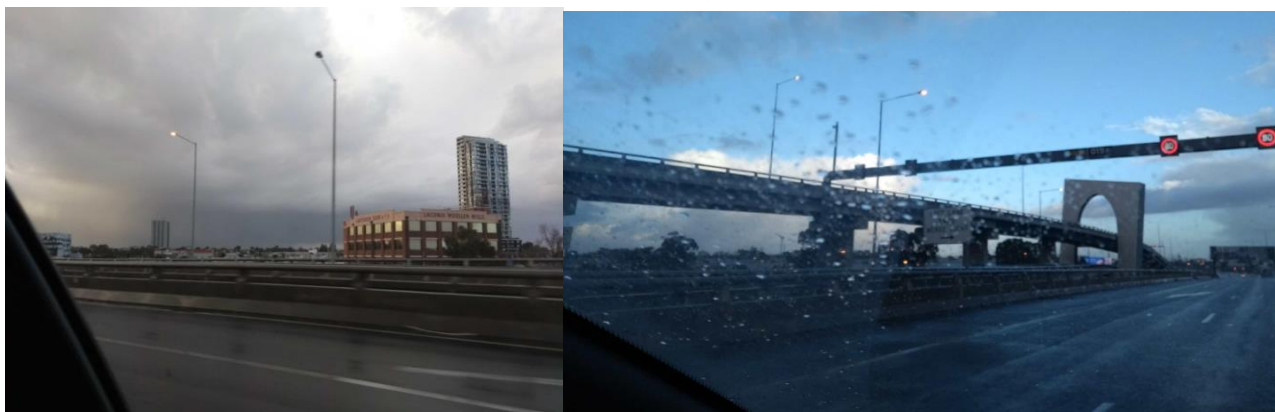

For those that were not aware of how the countback system works here it is in summary.

In the event of more than one player posting the same score, then the place rankings are allocated using the total number of stableford points made on the back nine. The player with the most points on holes 10 through 18 is deemed the higher ranked player. If the players can not be separated as the points total is the same then the count back starts from individual hole scores starting from the 18th hole and working backwards until a variance occurs.

In this instance Rick had 19-points so he became highest ranking. Stu and Mal both had 16 points on the back nine, then both had wifes on the 18th hole so the countback went to the 17th hole where Stu had 3 points compared to Mal who had 2, so in this case Stu is ranked higher.

It is interesting to Note that 75 was the best score when most months this score would usually only just fall inside the top 10-15. Obviously, it was very tough conditions out there. In hindsight we were pretty lucky the conditions weren't even worse. Certainly driving towards the Westgate Bridge on Sunday morning Col Ewart knew he was going to get pretty wet because the view looking forward towards Werribee was pretty grim. In fact by the time he crossed over the bridge the heavens had already opened and the rain started coming in sideways. When you consider there was hail storms and flash flooding in Melbourne, and the Kew golf course had to be closed for safety reason, we should be pleased we managed to get out on to the fairways at all.



It was great to have El Presidente' (SOS) back in the mix after several months in hibernation. Obviously Steve O'Sullivan didn't have too many practice rounds while he was jet-setting around Canada, North America and the USA because his scores were very ordinary.



Thanks to SOS for organizing the day in my absence, I am sure you were rewarded with a standing ovation and round of applause for your efforts.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field. The player in 1st place gets 15 points, 2nd place 14 points, 3rd place 13 points, etc. etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between 15th spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending.

The player with the most points at the end of the year is crowned the Points champion irrespective of how many rounds a person has played. If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in 2nd place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score, then that is bad luck to the person in 2nd place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke, so you need to count every shot that you play, and you need to finish every hole. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't

have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap, then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

All of our members are now on official handicaps.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

How to calculate a GA Handicap

To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by 0.93. The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.

* If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.

* There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.

* Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

Full Technical Procedure for Calculating a GA Handicap

STEP 1 – Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:

Number of Scores in Player's Handicap Scores to be Used in the Record Calculation

5 to 6	Best/Lowest 1
7 or 8	Best/Lowest 2
9 or 10	Best/Lowest 3
11 or 12	Best/Lowest 4
13 or 14	Best/Lowest 5
15 or 16	Best/Lowest 6
17 or 18	Best/Lowest 7
19 or 20	Best/Lowest 8

Note: When the handicap record contains more than 20 scores, the GA Handicap calculation uses the best 8 of the player's most recent 20 scores.
