## Werribee Park Golf Course Results June

What a difference a month can make. At the end of May, Greg Breasley was sitting 7 points clear on the championship point's leader board, and then suddenly 4 weeks later he is arrears by 7 points. It just goes to show how much consistency is an important factor in the season champion's trophy. Unfortunately for Greg, his worst round for 2013 did not put him in the points rundown and he only received the cursory 1 point for turning up, whereas his nearest rival, Gerard MacIsaac was one of the few players who completed the back nine at Werribee Park without falling in a heap. Gerard shot the lowest score for the day (83) off the stick and with his handicap of 10; it was good enough to win him his 7<sup>th</sup> monthly title, 15 championship points and allowed him to jump out into a commanding point's leader position.

In near perfect conditions on a brilliant golf course, the more difficult back nine was the downfall for many of the golfers. Slinky shot 45 on the front nine and had even borrowed a napkin and pen off the girl in the half way house as he began to pen his victory speech. Had it not been for a hiccup on the Par 3 fifteenth hole he may have come pretty close to presenting the speech too. Unfortunately Long John had a misadventure in the deep bunker in front of the fifteenth green and was unable to get his flop up, and therefore couldn't get his balls past the front lip. It took Slinky 9 shots to get out of the sand and he finished the short par three with a triple, triple bogie (twelve). Slinky did however make up for the blow out when, two holes later he hit his tee shot with his driver straight onto the long par three 17<sup>th</sup> hole green, and won the NTP on the 17<sup>th</sup> and made a very easy par.

Greg Breasley was tracking ahead of his handicap when he bought his first beer at the pie shop at the end of the ninth hole. Unfortunately that was the start of the end for Big Ball Breasley who only scored 10 stableford points on the back nine, compared to his 19 on the front side including 6 three pointers out of 7 holes. Such is the transformation in Greg's game that, he now curses himself for missing a par putt, when in the past he used to celebrate making one for double bogie.

Stu Coops was playing a very conservative round. He waltzed around the front nine using his three wood and therefore keeping the golf ball on the correct fairway. His reward was a respectable score of 44 at the turn. The lure of the longest drive prize and out muscling Mick Harper in the process was all too much for him and on the tenth hole the driver was taken out of retirement. Two golf balls later Stu was marking his scorecard with a nine and then he backed up the next hole with another lost ball and a score of quadruple bogie 8. The back nine saw Stu tumbling down the place rankings, he scored a disastrous 55 on the run home all because he got adventurous and dusted the icicles off the unreliable driver which as was to be expected instantly directed him onto all of the wrong parts of the golf course.

Stu wasn't the only person to get a bit wayward with the one wood. SOS had some troubles of his own. Steve produced a few large block-slices (which could have just about been called shanks) which found some of the parts of the golf course that are recommended to be avoided. Pete's approach to the fourth green hit the hizzle of his 7 iron and instead of going straight at the target it would have flown between third slip and gully on a cricket pitch. Dale Robinson and Phil Plane both copped a fine for being late to their hit off times.

The trip to Werribee Park is always a long one. Although Greg Parsons racked up over 212km on the return trip to the golf course from Mount Martha, it was Dale and Phil who failed to make the journey on time. Dale was restricted to the passenger seat because he was still over the 0.05 limit when he fell out of bed on Sunday morning having attended a trivia night at the local footy club on Saturday. Considering the dew on the green and the rain that we have already had this winter, the greens at Werribee Park were incredibly fast. Trevor on the other hand produced his best putting performance ever. We are not sure whether it was a coincidence that on the first time Trevor was partnered up with Gerard MacIsaac (the putting wizard) and suddenly his putt score for the round dropped by 9 strokes below his career average. Trevor’s score card represented a binary code chart with nearly all ones and zeros written in the putting column. It took Trevor only 13 Putts to complete the back nine and he seemed quite happy to hand over a sneaky \$20 to Gerard in the car park after the golf. Poor Joe was devastated and he was convinced that he shouldn’t have to count the tap in putt cos the ball had already hit the flag which was in the hole so in Joes is opinion that was close enough.

Gerard MacIsaac was the Monthly winner for the second time in season 2013. Tony MacIsaac is continuing to feature at the top of the leader board and narrowly missed his first ever title to Brother Gerard, losing in a countback with a score of Nett 73. Tony had a blistering front nine but was unable to maintain the momentum on the back half of the course and unfortunately that is the most important nine since the countback score is formulated as the number of stableford points a player scored on the back nine. Since the majority of the field struggled to score well, the non-handicap golfers have featured at the top end of the leadboard place rankings. Mills and Fedi finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> position and then a very generous handicap to Stuart Holbrook enabled him to place in the top 5 on his first game with the social club.

The most significant ranking for the week was Steve Powne’s beer wench qualifying performance. This could be a trend we will need to become accustomed too as Steve is familiarising himself with the concept of wearing the pink dress as the golf trip draws nearer.
