

It is time for everyone who hasn't already done so to make their nominations for the Sunday Leave Pass Players choice awards. Voting closes on the 15th November and so far only 5 of 40+ members have bothered to cast their votes. REMEMBER you can vote for multiple people in the same category if you think appropriate

The award categories are:

MOST IMPROVED PLAYER

This prize takes into account the player who is believed to have made the most significant improvement in their game over the duration of the year. A player who you think is doing much better now than they were at the start of 2011. Votes will be tallied from all of your peers and we will also take into consideration the change in each player's handicap through the 2011 season.



WORST IMPROVED PLAYER

This prize takes into account the player who is believed to have made the most significant downturn in their game over the duration of the year. A player who you think is doing much worse now than they were at the start of 2011. Votes will be tallied from all of your peers and we will also take into consideration the change in each player's handicap through the 2011 season.



LEATHER WEDGE

Each year the Leather Wedge award is given to the player who is best able to manipulate the rules of golf to help to improve their scorecard.

Actions such as kicking the ball out of the bushes with your foot when nobody looking. Not counting a short missed putt because you were only mucking around. Dropping another ball where yours was lost without taking the relevant penalties and creative accounting (just not counting all of your shots.) These are just some of the many different ways that someone can earn a nomination for the title of Leather Wedge winner. The leather wedge prize will be determined by an anonymous ballot with the person who receives the most votes from their peers being given the trophy.

ANGRY MAN AWARD

This is Category, was introduced to acknowledge some of the more memorable dummy spits out on the course during the year. Players may nominate a player for an individual temper tantrum and give a brief explanation of the events leading up to and preceding the dummy spit or otherwise nominate a single individual who they believe has the shortest fuse and worst temper on the fairways without specifying a particular single event.



Other prize categories for the Sunday Leave Pass Season include:

WOOD & SPOON (Worst average finishing position)

This prize takes into account the player who has the worst average place rankings for the season. In order to qualify a player must have played at least 6 rounds for the year. The total sum of all place finishes is divided by the number of rounds played.

BEER WENCH (WORST SCORE ON GOLF TRIP)

This prize is given to the player who has the worst Nett round on the Saturday of the Thurgoona Golf Trip. The Beer Wench will be made to wear a special Beer Wench Dress & T Shirt on Saturday night and will be required to serve drinks to all of the other players for a 2 hour period during dinner.

PLEASE NOTE: To make it totally clear the Beer Wench does not have to pay for the drinks with their own money but they must go to the bar and order drinks, using the fine jar kitty whenever they are asked to do so by fellow players.

BEST SCORE ON GOLF TRIP

This is no different to any other month only the prize is a little better. Prize Awarded to the best Nett Score on the Saturday round at Thurgoona.

SUNDAY LEAVE PASS 2011 CHAMPION

This is awarded to the person who accumulated the highest championship points throughout 2011.

Congratulations to Dale who has officially wrapped up the title because his lead is mathematically impossible to be caught since he is more than 15 points away from his nearest rival.

RUNNER UP- SUNDAY LEAVE PASS 2011 CHAMPION

This is awarded to the person who accumulated the 2nd highest championship points throughout 2011.

SKINS & RAFFLE DRAW

Once again the raffle draw will have some fantastic prizes. Raffle tickets have been awarded throughout the year to players for each round of golf that they have competed in. Extra tickets were also won in the monthly skins competition by winning a hole outright against the entire field. The more tickets you have won the greater the chances of winning a prize. A player can only win 1 prize out of the raffle. If your name is drawn out you win the prize but if you are drawn twice then you can choose which prize you would prefer to keep and the other prize is redrawn.

SUNDAY AMBROSE TEAMS EVENT (SUNDAY) (the Beer and Berrocca Shield)

This year the Ambrose competition will be taken as more of a feature event. We have a perpetual trophy and prizes will be awarded to the winning team. Ambrose will be a pair's event. We will try and make the teams as even as possible and randomly draw the high handicap with a low handicapper wherever possible. In an Ambrose game after each shot you take the ball in the best position and you both hit from that spot. You keep hitting until the ball is in the hole. The teams score is calculated on handicap basis.

BATTLE OF THE CHAMPIONS

The monthly winners play off for a Trophy and the title of Champion of Champions. The competitor's scores will be taken based on stableford points on 9 randomly selected mystery holes this event will be held on the Saturday in conjunction with the normal Monthly competition. The player with the most Stableford points will win. The November winner is in the competition but their scores are only taken from 8 of the nine holes.

Werribee Golf Course Results

After some scintillating scores last month at Dorset, it was a much tougher day at the Werribee Golf course despite the near perfect conditions. Last month a Nett 72 resulted in a ranking of 17th position and only 1 championship point, whereas at Werribee it was good enough to earn 15 points and the monthly title.

The sun was shining, the wind was calm, the fairways were pure, and in fact the only challenge was the recently cored and sanded greens. Most players struggled to come to terms with the slow, bumpy greens and three and four putts were the order of the day. Even big Mick Harper couldn't hit the ball hard enough to get the ball up to the hole and his scorecard was plagued with 5x 3 putts and a 4 putt green, which ultimately robbed him of what, would have otherwise been a very impressive round of golf.

It wasn't all bad news for Mick, he did manage to add yet another 2x birdies to his impressive eclectic stroke score and in a rare stroke of luck he actually managed to pick up some "skins jackpots" from the birdies in the process. After being skinless with 4x birdies at Dorset it was comforting to see Mick rewarded with a

massive haul of 12 skins this month. Stu Coops was the only other player to win any skins and he claimed a total of 4x skins with a couple of birdies of his own.

It was great to see Greg Parsons pick up his second Longest Drive title in 8 years. I suppose it could be said it is really his second in less than 12 months since for the first 7x years he never actually came close to winning it. Given that he drove from Mount Martha to Werribee then from Werribee to Chirnside Park before going back to Mount Martha it was only fitting that he won the longest drive prize, after all he must have clocked up at least a couple of hundred kilometres and used a full tank of petrol for the day.

Gerard MacIsaac had a struggle with the concept of a long drive all morning, he only just dribbled his ball past the squatters tee's on the first hole and then it didn't get much better from there. For the first time in the clubs history Gerard was called up for a \$5-00 fine for failing to hit past the ladies tees, although he wants it reported that he still managed to par the hole anyway.

The early morning rise for a 630am hit off had little effect on Phil Plane who was able to knock his ball onto the 3rd green to claim a nearest to pin hole. Although it was a monumental moment, he wasn't sure what was more disappointing, failing to capitalise on a good chance for the par or the fact that his mate Neil wasn't there to see it, because he was still stuck to the bar stool at the Ferntree Gully Hotel and never made it to the golf course at all.

Greg Breasley had a feeling of DeJaVu. After spending the last couple of weeks at the beach in Sunny Queensland, Greg re-lived the experience by spending 10 minutes in the sand on the 8th hole. Apparently he was playing in the sand and out of sight for so long that his playing partners weren't sure if he had dozed off and gone to sleep in the bunker or whether he may have fallen down a fox hole. The only reason they knew he was still in bunker was that there were at least 5x separate splashes of sand which come flying out on to the green accompanied with an assortment of loud expletives. Greg shifted so much sand onto the greens that a couple of holes later the grounds keeper came up to him, tapped him on the shoulder and asked him if he wanted to help them the next time they were coring the greens.

The top of the leader's board was a very close contest; in fact the monthly title was won after a three way countback. Steve Powne won him the honours with his 72 Nett and 19 stableford points on the back nine and booked as spot in the Champion of Champions playoff's at Thurgoona. Steve relished the opportunity to play with Big Mick, it become obvious that playing with a good golfer was just what he needed to take his game to the next level. Steve drove further and swung harder than he has ever done in his life and was a deserved winner.

Junior Grasso also scored a Nett 72, but unfortunately his front nine was better than his back nine so the count back did not fall in his favour. Stu Coops started the front nine with 22 stableford points including birdies on the second and fourth holes. By the time he was sitting on a short 2meter birdie Putt on the 9th hole he was already starting to write his victory speech and that's when everything went pear shaped. Unfortunately Stu 3putted for bogey on the ninth green and then suddenly the driver started to hit crooked again, he lost 3 or 4 balls on the back nine and limped his way into third place, or what I would like to call equal first.

Rick Turcinovic returned after a 3 month layoff with a new approach to his game. He was composed, relaxed and left the goat fondling to everyone else. Rick was only one stroke off his chance to claim his maiden victory and he surprised himself when he arrived back in the car park and suddenly realized that he had completed the entire 18 holes without accruing a single fineable offence.

Phil Plane was undeterred by the early start; he completed the 18 holes in 108 strokes and finished in equal second place, losing to Rick on a count back. Tony Grasso and Steve O'Sullivan managed to out maneuver the championship leaders both of the boys hitting Nett 74 scores to finish in 6th and 7th spots respectively.

Dale and Big Mick plummeted down the leader board this month. Dale had his worst finish for the season and was only able to scrape into the top 10 with his Nett 75.
