

Putting ball on, back off the green	\$2-00

Any other act performed on the course which is deemed to be deserving of a fine can be put to the group for a vote after the game.

\$2-00 Maximum pay out is \$10-00.

Just a reminder that we are enforcing a late payment of golf fees fine. The payment for each month is due no later than the Thursday the week final numbers are due.

There were a few guys upset about being charged the extra \$5 for late payment but there is no excuse for late payment since everyone receives at least a minimum of two reminder emails and a text message prior to the due date. Players who fail to meet the deadline are charged a late payment levy of \$5-00 on top of the original golf fee's. Anyone who finds it too difficult to make the EFT transfer on time is welcome to make a larger transfer and keep some money in credit for when they fail to make the payments on time.


## Werribee Park Golf Course Results

# August

Having spent the last week and a bit in Bali my brain is suffering from volcanic ash exposure poisoning so I am going to keep this month's results blurb short and sharp. And besides everyone who played on Sunday already knows who has won as he spent all of the time working out the scores and cross checking other competitors' handicaps off the Sunday Leave Pass website to make sure he was definitely going to win while we were in the car park drinking beers.

Congratulations to Dale who was correct in his arithmetic, he finished in first place beating Grumpy by just a single stroke. Dale was in blistering form and shot a very impressive 88 off the stick (Nett 69). Dale's 15 championship points that he scored has elevated him above his old mate Rick on the Sunday Leave Pass points championship leaderboard.

It was a perfect weekend for Dale as he also went all the way in the Herald Sun Supercoach competition and therefor claimed first prize for taking out the grand final. Dale will be rewarded with the lions share of the dream team prize pool.



Supercoach himself actually scored the most points for the season and he was also rewarded with a share of the prize pool. I will be in touch with the winners to transfer money into their nominated bank accounts or use as credit for the golf trip.

The only blemish on the entire day for Dale was a wayward golf shot that nearly decapitated Peter Hutson. It was only Peter's quick reflexes when he heard the call of "fore" that saved him from being severely injured, Peter actually managed to evade the ball which had he not ducked to the side would have most certainly hit him. I will let you decide for yourselves if the blemish was that Dale hit the wayward shot or if the blemish was the fact that he actually missed Peter.

Having seen the close call earlier in the round Highway had concerns of his own about hitting someone. After hitting a drive on to the wrong fairway Newell refused to play a shot while Rick was standing in front of him. Once Rick finally moved clear of the firing line Newell only managed to launch his 3 wood, six meters and his divot went an extra 8 meters further down the fairway towards Rick who replied "good on ya Newell at that rate it would have taken you at least another 4 shots to get the ball past me."

Highway did play some good shots though, after playing practice rounds on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday his swing tempo was in a good space and he finished the day with an impressive score of 107 and finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

A few practice rounds may have been a good investment for Rick who was unable to keep up his momentum and failed to win the illusive hat-trick of titles. For quite a while it was looking as if he might actually go from the winners jacket to the pink vest especially after hit 63 on the front nine, but Rick did recover on the back nine and played some very impressive consistent golf representative of a player who is capable of winning back to back monthly titles.

Tony MacIsaac was also locking in pole position to be crowned the beer wench title, he was almost down to his last good golf ball before he get past the 5th hole. Tony hit balls out of bounds on the first hole, second hole, third hole and a couple OOB on the 4<sup>th</sup>

hole. The irony was his second balls or provisional balls were long and straight down the middle of the fairway. On the 5<sup>th</sup> tee Tony decided to call his first drive a provisional ball and low and behold it went straight down the middle. For the last 13 holes by playing his first shot as a provisional he never looked like losing a ball and his game and scores improved markedly.

Gerard MacIsaac who was the Sunday Leave Pass putting champion 2010, 2011, 2012, and 2013 has fallen from grace in a big way, Gerard suffered the humiliation of a 6 putt green, yes that's right a six putt, not a three putt worthy of the yellow vest, not a four putt worthy of a \$2 fine but it actually took him six shots with the putter to get his ball in the hole.

Ron had a pretty tough day of it at Werribee Park, obviously the 140 km trip from Pakenham took its toll because the usually ever reliable Ron struggled with most areas of his game. Ron got stuck in a bunker for what seemed an eternity and it was only when he was finally told by his playing partners to hit out sideways that he managed to get his ball out of the sand trap.

Ron tried to blame his substandard form on the fact that he had left his golf shoes at home but no-one was buying that excuse, although he did look funny walking around the course in his Italian hand crafted fine leather loafers. It wasn't however a total waste of a day for Ronnie especially since he made a par on the 14<sup>th</sup> hole to win an 8x hole skin jackpot.

There was no silver lining for Andrew Clarke who finished the day in pink vest territory. Andrew never recovered from the devastating 14 that he scored on the second hole. Andrew took six shots to get his ball out of the sand and then once he was finally on the putting surface he followed that debacle with a four putt green. By the time Andrew arrived at the Werribee Park zoo he was pretty much a lock for the Beer Wench vest for September as his score of 110 Nett 93 was 7 shots adrift of his nearest rival.

Scores this month were split 50/50. The top 10 players all carded respectable totals in the low Nett 70's while the second half of the field were all in the 80's except for Andrew who we are all looking forward to seeing at Ringwood in his bright pink beer wench vest.

Dale was the best performer shooting a score of 69 whichever way you look at it that was a great round, Grumpy finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> pace with a score of 91 off the stick which was his best round for a while. Highway continues to pester the top end of the leaderboard, he continues to play more golf than a touring professional and since Amazing Golf filed for bankruptcy he has since located a new site in the city for his regular virtual golf lesson tutorage sessions. #### REMINDER HOW 3 PUTT MONKEY GAME WORKS





\*As part of the putting competition this year, as a brainchild suggestion from Paul Blizzard we have introduced the Three Putt Monkey game. At the start of each round every group will be given a flouro yellow 3 Putt Monkey vest and whenever a person has a <u>3 putt or worse</u> that player must put on the 3 Putt Monkey Vest and wear it until another player in the group has a <u>3 putt or more</u>. The player wearing the 3 putt Monkey vest at the completion of the 18<sup>th</sup> hole will be required to chip in an additional \$2 into the fine jar. If multiple players have a <u>3 putt or worse</u> the player who was last into the hole wins the vest irrespective of whether the other player before them had a <u>3 putt, four putt or even a seven putt.</u> The furthest player from the hole should always putt first on the green and that player is deemed as in control and therefore has the option of marking their ball if they miss the putt or putting out. If they chose to putt out and then the following person three putts then the last person to putt out gets the vest.

The Werribee Park course was good to some people and brutal to others, the handicapper took that in to consideration and savaged large chunks from the handicap of the good performers and gave some back to the battlers. Dale was stripped of nearly a full shot, even Highway was docked 0.6 while Andrew was given back ½ a stroke and interestingly even Rick who has been in great form was bumped up from 31 to 32 handicap for next month at Ringwood.

### **HANDICAPS**

The changes to player's handicaps are as follows:

**BOLD RED NUMBERS**- refer to players whose handicap has gone out

**BOLD GREEN NUMBERS-** refer to players whose handicap has come in

BOLD BLACK NUMBERS- refer to players whose handicap has remained unchanged

NON BOLD NUMBERS- refer to players who didn't play this month so handicap has not changed
