
Any feedback on this concept would be much appreciated, obviously they are doing it in the hope that some of us part with a bit of coin and purchase some goodies on the night.



Werribee Park Golf Course Results June

It was good to see that Peter Hutson was able to drag him self away from the celebrations to join us for a round of golf. For the last week Peter has been up to his ears in festivities as he has been celebrating the most momentous occasion of his life. It was 12 months ago almost to the day that Peter's life changed forever and for the better. Although he has said it 365 times (once a day) since that magical moment it has been 12 months since Peter uttered those famous four words for the first time "I BOUGHT A JEEP". Apparently Pete had a special "I'm a star cos I bought a jeep" fancy dress anniversary party to celebrate the occasion and he even baked a special cake. Unfortunately none of his golf mates got a guernsey but rumours are it was an awesome bash.



What isn't known to most people yet because he hasn't brought it out to play yet is that Pete also recently added a baby jeep to his expanding jeep family. Drop into his office any day to see him and invariably the staff can't find him because he will either be on the putting green, at the driving range or out on the golf course somewhere. We could all learn a lot from Gerard and some of our members have taken him up on his offer of advice and most of them are flourishing in his mentorship. Take Highway (Newell Richards) for example who under the Gerard MacIsaac golf academy is improving every

month and he is therefore becoming a more competitive force especially with the very high handicap that that we are starting to regret ever giving to him.

It seems practice does lead to improvement. Highway has come a long way since that fateful round at Kingston links when he actually scored 169 and had a 17 on a par 3 hole.

This month at Werribee Park Newell had a run of two successive pars and finished inside the top 15 for multiple points for the first time ever and Highway showed a level of competency with the golf clubs that previously seemed unimaginable.

The proof is in the scorecards and evidently all the lessons and practice swings have been fruitful for the golf skills if not for the backyard lawn which has turned from a manicured MCG like surface to a pock marked green moon crater landscape.

Admittedly Newell has racked up over 100,000 frequent flyer points at the Morack driving range and has taken out a second mortgage on the house to pay for his regular visits to the pros.

There was a bit of tension at the Richards household recently when credit card statements started showing weekly visits to a variety of venues for inter-course liaisons. It wasn't until Highway was able to prove to his wife Sarah that the sessions with the pros at MGA, Morack and Wattle Park were actually golf related and he hadn't suddenly turned into a desperate nymphomaniac.

In his own quest for personal development Trevor unveiled his secret weapon. Trevor pulled out the super high tech DOT PLX putter to try to alleviate him from his putting woes. Trevor has always struck the ball with the precision and prowess of a single mark handicapper but then he squanders his scoring opportunities with the putting skills of a 2 year old chimpanzee swinging a wet tea towel. Although the DOT PLX putter didn't elevate him to instant mastery with the flat stick, he did manage to sink a couple of 1 putt greens and for the first time in eighteen rounds he actually had less than 40 putts for the day.

Stu Coops is the ultimate encouragement for anyone who has ever struggled with the flat stick. For the past 11 years Stu has struggled with the putter but this year however with the guidance of the DOT PLX putter practice sessions he has suddenly become the number one putter in the social club. Stu is averaging only 30 putts per round and his worst putting score for 2014 is 33 putts and this month at Werribee Park he was in sensational form with the flat stick completing the entire 18 holes with only 26 putts.

Big Mick needn't have bothered carrying the putter as he was hitting his approach shots straight at the flag stick. Mick nearly chipped in for eagle on the par 5 eleventh hole when his ball bounced off the flagstick and then his chip on the next hole also lipped out for birdie after it rolled straight over the side of the cup.

Phil Plane also managed to hit the ball very accurately. Phil described the Par 3, 8th hole as the best hole that he has ever played in his Sunday Leave Pass golfing career. Phil hit a perfect hybrid club off the tee which flew high and straight at the heart of the green, unfortunately the ball flight was impeded by a severe head wind and the ball just caught the top lip of the bunker directly in front of the hole. Undeterred by the unlucky outcome of what was otherwise a brilliant shot Phil waded into the bunker and splashed out a perfect flop shot which lifted the ball out of the sand onto the top of the flag stick where the ball then dropped straight down the pole, bounced off the lip of the hole and came to rest only six inches from the cup setting up the easiest of tap in Putts for par. Unfortunately the Par didn't yield him a bag of skins as the hole

was Jackpotted but with three perfect shots the 8th hole at Werribee Park will be long remembered as one of his all-time favourites.

Hitting your golf ball into things appeared to be the order of the day. Ben Nichol skinnied his pitching wedge through the second green and then his golf ball careered into the bags of the players in the group in front. Ben's ball ricocheted off a retaining wall before smashing into not one, not two but three golf buggies parked next to the tee.

Shane Cumming used outside assistance to stop his shanked golf ball from running out of bounds into the adjoining polo club. Shane's ball was making a direct beeline for the fence when it collided with the 150 meter marker and bounced back out onto the fringe of the second fairway. Shanno also came unstuck on the ninth hole when he got his golf swing too close to a hazard marker. He claims it was an accident and says that the impact just occurred during the process of normal play but anyone who bends their golf club by wrapping it around a metal hazard marker gets elevated high up on the voting list for angry man nominations.

Slinky hit his drive into the monument wishing well on the 18^{th} hole. Phil Plane hit a wayward drive from the 18^{th} hole which disappeared down the crevasse and came within meters of clonking the players in the group playing on the 16^{th} tee on the head.

SOS actually managed to hit Greg Breasley flush on the leg when he hit up on the group in front before they had cleared the green. El Presidente was piecing together yet another good score and became increasingly impatient when the group in front were playing slow golf and therefor holding up play. SOS fired off a warning shot with a six iron to try to give them all a bit of a hurry up but the plan backfired because despite everyone calling "fore" at the top of their voices Greg Breasley was not able to get out of the way quick enough and the Titliest 2 smashed into Greg's shin bone at full pace. Hitting Greg did not have the desired outcome because the speed of play suddenly slowed down even more, as Greg was required to limp home over the last four holes with a bruised leg with a swelling hematoma the size of an egg.

Although SOS took out Greg Breasley he was probably better off setting his sights on the ex-president Stu Coops who after about 6 years in the doldrums is having a very good season in 2014. Stu has suddenly worked out that playing with the one golf ball for 18 holes eliminates the 6-10 penalty shots per round that come with losing golf balls on every second to third hole and therefore the scores at the end of the day suddenly look a whole lot more respectable. Stu was only just able to keep his nose in front of SOS at Werribee and therefore claiming his second monthly title for the year with Nett 72. Scores were all tied at Nett 72 but Stu ended up beating SOS on a countback with 20 stableford points on the back nine holes compared to El Presidente who had 18 points.

Slinky however is the player of the season so far. From just three rounds this year he has accrued 41 championship points. Slinky's average place position in 2014 on the Wood and Spoon rankings is 2.33. He has had two runners ups and a third place and he sits in 4th spot on the players point championship ranking despite only playing three rounds for the year. Who knows a few more good finishes and he might end up as a last minute entry to the end of year golf trip so that he can collect the season championship trophy.

Karl Winters has qualified for an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap and in doing so managed to play his best round yet which resulted in a very healthy fourth place finish with Nett 75, Karls score was equal with slinky but he lost on a countback.

As is to be expected during the colder wetter Winter months the single handicap markers are working their way to the top. Big Mick shot the equal lowest gross score for the day with 84 off the stick and Gerard hit 88 which by his terms is a bad day but was still adequate to score him 9 championship points for a 6th place finish.

Peter Hutson, Andrew Clarke, Trevor Adair and Tony senior rounded out the top 10 with Nett scores in the low 80's and then the field spread out right back to the Beer Wench position that went to Dale who failed to

live up to his usual high standards and had a disappointing 117 Nett 98, ironically he did win the longest drive and claimed the nearest to pin prize for a good shot into the very difficult par 3 seventeenth hole.

A noteworthy mention goes to Newell (Highway) who has surprised all around him by elevating himself out of his permanent Beer Wench position and posting a score good enough to get him a top 15 finish. In fact Newell ended up in 13th spot with Nett 84 which, is a remarkable effort considering that just 3 months ago he had never broken Nett 100.


