X GOLF Knox Golf Results July

The first Sunday Leave Pass Social Club, Social night was a great succes. We ended up with a field of 23 players attending the X golf round on Friday night and the event had all of the excitement and adventure of a normal Sunday competition without the 6000meter walk.



What a blast it was to be able to engage with every booth so you had a good grasp of how everyone was travelling at all times. There was some great scores across the night although the standard of golf deteriorated as the beer tally grew larger. The handicapper generously gave out 106 extra strokes for the 106 drinks consumed across the five groups, with Steve O'Sullivan getting the biggest boost with 8 strokes for the 8 beers that he polished off over the duration of the night.

Incredibly SOS was one under par after 8 holes and still square with the card after 12. He did eventually dump a few strokes as the Furphy's kicked in towards the end of the night but he still managed to close out the round at 3 over par 73.

The best gross score for the day came from both SOS a ringin by the name of Ryan who spends even more time on the golf course than even highway does. Ryan is the trainee at Waterford Valley, so it was expected that he shouldn't have too much difficulty playing computer golf. Ryan hit an impressive 73 off the stick for a Callaway Handicap of 1 and more importantly he improved his score by 4 Beer shots which were added to his handicap.

Brendan and Dale got the day off to a good start by both birding the first hole. Stu Coops could have gone even better after he drove the green on the first hole but he then proceeded to four putt the same hole for a bogie. Stu struggled with the computer simulation of the putting stroke and the end result was his worst putt score for the year and he wore the Three Putt Monkey vest for nearly the entire 18 holes.



There was much argument and it was point of conjecture as to whether Stu's drive should be considered the longest drive because it was on the green and not the fairway. For the record and for future reference according to the rules of golf, the fairway or through the green is all of the cut surfaces, including fairways, green fringes and greens. It was all to no avail anyway because after 17 attempts big Mick finally got one out of the screws and knocked his drive 289.6 meters to win the longest drive competition.

In spite of not being able to Putt all night Stu was in a healthy position on the score rankings, strangely somehow he dumped the majority of his bad scores on the last couple of holes when the Supercoach and his mad brother decided to sabotage his game by realigning his drives into the rough where they were expecting his drives to be going on a more regular basis. Although Stu had a good swing going, compared to the photo above, he didn't quite look as good as the woman playing in the bay next to him.

The supercoach was better placed playing with the girl next door because he failed to get his drive passed the ladies tees on a couple of separate occasions, as he does during almost every round that he plays. Admittedly one of his failures was because his brother Chris threw the ball at the screen during Fils back swing and the computer picked up the rolling ball as his swing rather than his actual ball strike.

Revenge was not sweet for the Supercoach because when an hour later when he tried to return the favour. While Chris was trying to play a chip shot Fils throw during his brothers backswing, backfired and he actually threw the ball onto the green and into the hole.

Leigh showed the power of youth knocking his longest drive only a whisker under 280 meters although the most powerful hitter for the night was Grumpy, who after not getting one off for 4 months actually blew his balls apart. Brendan shot a sub 80 round and aided by 7 beers was able to finish inside the top 5 with a score of Nett 55.

Greg Parsons went one better, Greg actually managed to break the entire XGolf machine. It was just lucky that the staff came prepared with a power drill, three shifters, a roll of Gaffa tape and a hammer, and after 15 minutes and a bit of crash and bash and Greg was able to continue his round of golf. Unfortunately for Greg it wasn't to be back to back victory rounds, however his score of 92 was very respectable and despite only having a couple of frothies he still managed to finish inside the top 10.



Much to Chris Sfiligoj's disappointment, Tom Kellythorn made a last minute registration just to protect his points championship lead. Tom arrived without his golf clubs, however was still able to post a significant score using Steve Pownes clubs. Steve's clubs were a very good choice as they were working well on Friday night. Tom finished his round with Nett 56 and only conceded 2 points to the Good Sfiligoj, (Chris) who finished in 4th spot with 15 under Nett 55.

Although Steve Powne's clubs were good to Tom, they were working even more brilliantly for the Blue Smurf himself. Stevie P. was inspired by the good form shown by both Tom and SOS. Stevie P. forgot that he was meant to be a 22 handicapper and he was still even par after 6 holes including 2 birdies. It wasn't until a crash tackle and a chicken wing grip from big Mick jarred his neck and dislocated his shoulder and then when the 5th of his 7 beers started to influence his vision and speech Steve started to have a couple of blemishes on the scorecard. In the end Steve still rolled his putt in on the 18th hole to close out his round with three birdies, 80 strokes, and a mind boggling 1st place finish with a score of Nett 51.



The scorecards looked more like a mini golf scores than actual proper golf rounds. The golfer in 22nd place was only four over par Nett 74 and then there was Geoff Cooper who racked up a Newlesque type of round. Geoff was given the pink vest before he even hit off on the first hole and it was a perfect fit. The beer wench vest remained firmly wrapped around Geoff's shoulders especially since he averaged hitting the ball 105 meters per swing, and he averaged 3 putts per green. Geoff finished 19 strokes in arrears to his nearest rival and incredibly 42 shots behind Stevie Pownes winning score. The chorus for the night was "hurry up Geoff it is your shot again" and it usually was true because often Geoff would hit the ball three times before anyone else in his group actually had the opportunity to play a shot. Were it not for the double par maximum limit per hole there was a high probability that Geoff would have beaten his record score of 24 strokes on a single hole.



Any hope of Geoff beating someone was blown out the window when Brendan MacIsaac, Barry and Newell all beat him off the stick. Brendan has been in hibernation since the golf trip last year however despite not picking up a golf club for more than 8 months he was still able to shoot 111 to finish under par with Nett 68. Newell went sub 100 (99) and Barry had a noteworthy score of 104.

Congratulations to Steve Powne who excelled on a day when all others performed admirably. Steve won 15 Championship points for his career best round. 80 off the stick. Steve O'Sullivan was on track to shoot a sub par round, he had 11 pars and two birdies before the beers started to get the better of him, however second place was nothing to sneeze about and 73 is a great score at anytime. The supercoach finished the night in third place finishing one stroke ahead of Chris and Grumpy who both scored Nett 55.
