Congratulations to Colin Ewart who was the stand out performer for the day at Yarrambat Park. Not even his playing partners parking their golf buggies in the wrong spot and blocking his golf balls flight path was enough to hold him back from winning his maiden monthly title after 44 attempts at bat. Until Sunday afternoon Col had the honour of having the second longest drought for victories in the Sunday Leave Pass record books. Unfortunately or fortunately depending on how you look at it, with his win at Yarrambat he has fallen 68 rounds short of catching Tony MacIsaac who's current record is growing by the month. Incredibly Tony has now played 112 rounds without raising the silverware. As a result of Colin breaking the duck it now means that Tony's only remaining rivals are Mal Griffiths (6), Nathan (4), Damien (14), Brad (10), Barry (15) and his brother Brendan Mac (11) who as a collective group plus Cliffy Rowe who now holds the second longest victory drought being none for 21, have racked up 81 rounds without a monthly title.

Col hit the ball brilliantly all day and as a result he posted his second best score for the 2017 season, on several occasions he had the opportunity to take his score even lower and were it not for the fact that his ball smashed into his playing partners golf buggy and golf bag and ricocheted into trouble he probably could have shot a low 90's score. Nett 65 was a great effort and Col was a deserved winner.

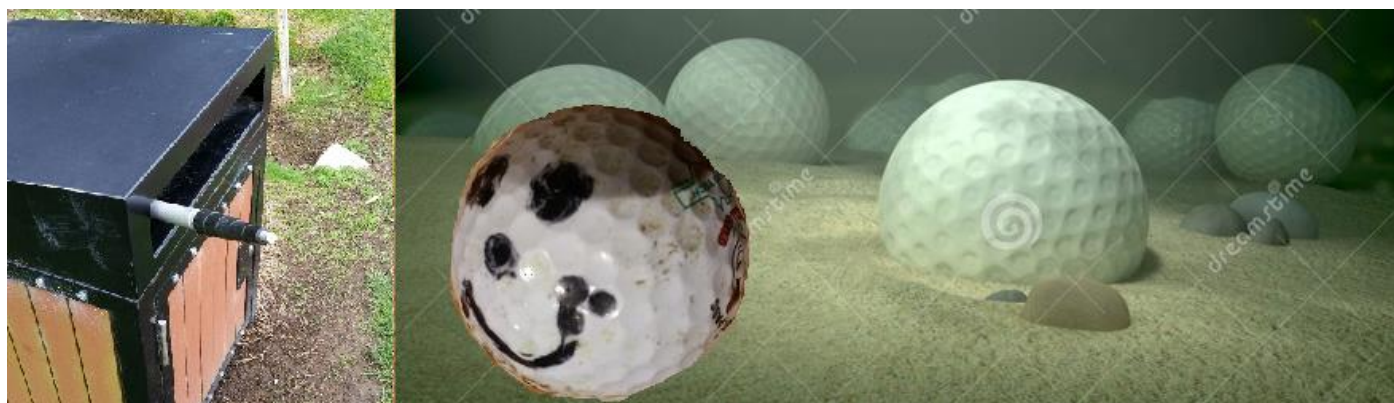
Col wasn't the only one to be hitting things other than his golf ball around the course. After boosting the sugar levels by devouring two egg and bacon rolls at the half way house, Brad Hughes smashed a drive down the 10th fairway. His ball bounced 10 meters short of poor SOS who was still moving a little sluggishly after his BOG drinking performance at X golf last week, SOS was unable to get out of the way quick enough and the ball smashed into his shin and deflected off into the rough.

SOS was left with a small bruise on the leg but nothing in comparison to Jamie Brunton's toes after they were hit by a golf ball twice in just four holes. Jamie copped a two stroke penalty and broken ego on the second hole when he knocked his ball into the tree directly in front of him and the ball bounced back into his foot. This happened after a disastrous start to the hole when his drive had failed to get past the ladies markers, in fact his drive never actually cleared the men's tee box. Needless to say it was a bad second hole for Jamie and he carded one of the only two Newell's recorded for the day. (Ben Nichol also had a Newell on the Par five 7th hole.)

Just a couple of holes later Jamie's already swelling foot received another whack when Stu Coops knocked his ball into a tree trunk causing the golf ball to take a detour towards Jamie who was standing beside the green. Luckily for Stu, Jamie's foot was able to slow the golf ball down. The pain for Jamie was actually a pleasure for Stu because his ball was heading off the back of the green and he took full advantage and made a simple up and down for a score of 9 saving him the humiliation of having to record a Newell on the score card.

To his credit Jamie was able to limp his way around the rest of the golf course, although his golf was definitely more a coast than a limp. In spite of his 10, Brunto recovered to shoot a very credible score of 100 and finished with Nett 73 and inside the top 10 placings.

It became quite obvious that the voting for the player's choice awards ballot is just around the corner because Rick (I like trophies) Turcinovic brought out his A-game. To date Ricks behaviour on the golf course has been relatively sedate this season however after a 3 putt green on the 8th hole his application for Angry Man 2017 award was all but accepted. The scream of frustration could be heard as far as Greensborough, he lost his golf ball in the dam when he kicked it off the green, he then threw his golf club from the 8th green to the 9th tee and smashed the end off of his Golf Ball retriever which ended up in the rubbish bin after Rick fetched his ball from the pond and he noticed that it was smiling at him with a wry grin while he was angry.



Interestingly it must have been all for show, because Rick actually had a good day out on the course by his standards. Rick had 3x four pointers, in the form of 2x pars and it even included a birdie on the par 5 eleventh hole. His worst score for the day was only an 8 so it was a good result as a whole especially with a top 10 finish, a couple of skins and Rick finished only four strokes behind 3rd place.

After a run of poor form and following on from winning the Beer Wench title at Ringwood last month the EX-Supercoach has justifiably handed over his mantle to Brad Hughes who with a handicap of 11 thinks he is better qualified to dish out free advice

to his playing partners. Considering Mark Sfiligoj (ex Supercoach) hit a shank off the first tee shot which went over the left shoulder of his playing partners and disappeared onto the 18th fairway it is warranted that he no longer has any claim to be the Supercoach. While his partners waited on the green in disbelief for Mark to finish the hole, Fil shanked his next shot as well and he started setting up to play his 3rd stroke from alongside of the 10th hole. After being beaten for the longest drive by Tom Kellythorn at Ringwood and having only won the power hitting title twice for the year Big Mick decided it was time to buy himself a new driver. Stu delivered Micks brand new Titleist Driver still in the wrapper to him in the carpark however were it not for a 288 meter bomb straight down the middle on the ninth hole it might have been going straight back to Spring Park marked return to sender. Micks first shot with the new club travelled about 60 meters and only 40m of those were in a forward direction.

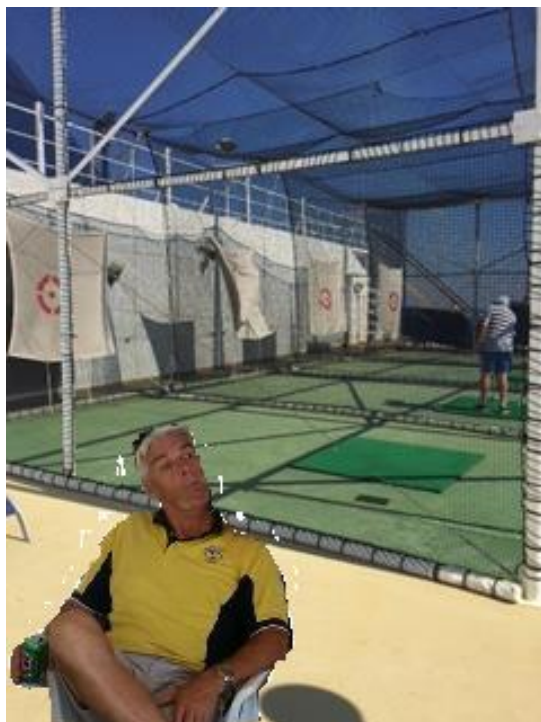
Stu Coops proved that it was the operator which was at fault and not the equipment by knocking his first drive with exactly the same type of driver over the longest drive marker on the fly beating Andrew Clarke by 50 meters. It appeared as though Andrew must have been having a blinder of a round, because he had his name registered on the longest drive and a couple of the NTP markers before being knocked off by the final grouping on each occasion.

Nathan Griffiths played his only good shot for the day into the par 3 16th hole. Witnesses say that perhaps it wasn’t such a good shot after all and the ball may have rolled all of the way along the ground to finish only a meter or two behind the hole. Luckily for Nathan the 16th hole was a temporary par 3 hole playing at only 98 meters and downhill all the way. Stu Coops showed how easy it was to play the hole by throwing a couple of balls from the elevated tee and both finished pin high on the fringe of the green.

Nathan battled all day and he found the going tough. He finished the afternoon with 82 Nett and will be devastated to know that he will have to put on and wear the beer wench vest next month after baring witness to it being adorned by the Ex Supercoach for 5 & 1/2 hours on Sunday. If you are looking for voting candidates for the Sunday Leave Pass Awards you might want to consider both Mark and Nathan for Least Improved players and while you are at it they have filed a fair case to be considered for Leather Wedge as well. Evidently both Mark and Nathan were trying to convince their playing partners that there was actually a rule in golf where a player can take a nominated two putt and pick up the ball when they are putting on a temporary green like the 16th hole at Yarrambat. Sounds like a fantasy world to me but it shows just how lacking in confidence the boys were with the flat stick.

A two putt gimmie would have come in handy on the 14th hole when Stu Coops turned an 11 foot birdie putt into a double bogie. There were plenty of players who found the recently cored and renovated greens frustratingly slow however when you look at the putting statistics for the day they were much better than the usual putting scores. There were no nine putt greens this month (Newell), only 5x four putts and only Ron Parsons and Slinky topped in as the worst putters by having in excess of 40 putts for the day.

If you missed Douggo on Sunday it was probably because he was not playing golf but doing a round of drinks on a cruise ship around the Mediterranean while his were mates hitting balls in the driving range. Apparently it is a slow old trip but someone has to do it.



Speaking of slow trips, the fine jar was topped up dramatically by the last group of the day who arrived back at the car park just as the sun was going down. Had Stu, Jamie, Newell and Jason played for much longer and they would have had to put in an application for a Monday Leave Pass as well. The irony of the group being so slow was the fact that Jason is actually the vice-captain of the Yarrambat Golf Course and during the round he was telling us how the club committee had made a local competition rule that in the event of a group falling a complete hole behind the players in front of them then the entire group are actually disqualified from the days competition. If that was the case with the Sunday Leave Pass rules then Stu, Jamie and Newell would have been disqualified for the next 3 months because they ended up finishing their round more than three holes behind the guys in front.

Congrats to Col Ewart on his maiden 15 pointer, it was a great round by him and with a score of Nett 65 he left Wayne James gasping for air because the best he could come up with was a 69. Highway was very solid, the three practise rounds and the lesson on Saturday morning worked in his favour. Newell had nothing higher than a 7 on the scorecard. At the moment it seems that Newell's handicap and his scores are dropping just as quickly as the weight is off his midriff.

The day should have belonged to Ronnie Parsons who finished in 4th place with Nett 71. Ron could have been able to give Col and Wayne a run for their money when you take into consideration that he had 41 putts for the round.

Ian Mutes, Stu Coops, Brad and Jamie all posted significant scores to get them inside the top 10 and when you take away the fact that Jamie had a 10 on the second hole and Stu had a nine on the sixth hole there must have been some good golf played over the other holes to catch up to the field.

Birdies were a plenty on Sunday, Mick, Steve P, Col, Cliff, Rick, Brad, Mal and Stu all racked up a birdie and Jason Gianginis used his local knowledge to have a couple more. Big Mick, SOS and Stu all had an opportunity to putt for an eagle however the slow bumpy greens did not deliver the desired result.
