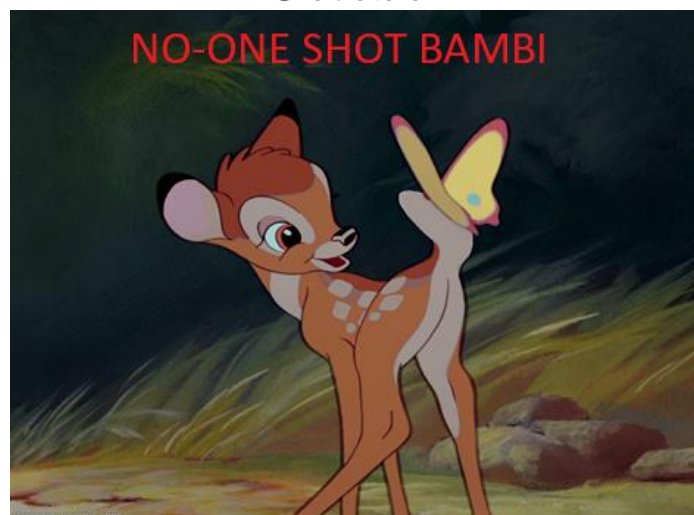

Sundays golf competition was a cliff hanger and the results came down to a countback between Shane Cummings and Tony MacIsaac, however after many close calls and devastating losses, the results finally fell in Tony's favor. In the event of a tied score, (in this case both players had Nett Score of 66) then the winner is then determined by using a count back system. The countback is formulated by the total number of stableford points scored on the back nine holes. In this instance Tony had 23 points on the homeward holes compared to Shanno who had 22, therefore Tony was awarded the victory and his first ever Sunday Leave Pass monthly crown.

What a great outcome for Tony, especially since he nearly cost himself the trophy when he racked up a score of 7 on the second hole after having an air-swing. It was nearly a very costly mistake, not because it cost him \$7 (\$5 for failing to hit his ball past the ladies tees and \$2 for having an air-swing) rather because that swing and miss came very close to knocking him out of the title winning position.

Thankfully, Tony kept his head and recovered, his next shot flew 220 meters straight down the middle of the fairway. From there he gained in confidence, producing some of the best golf he has ever played. Tony had 3 pars for the day, but most importantly he had successive pars on the 16th and 17th holes. These Pars were major wins, because each of those pars was on what was classed as a very difficult rated hole where he got two strokes. Pars on the 16th and 17th holes yielded him 4 points on each, hence pushing him up to the top of the leader board.

Tony's score of 97 was not quite his career best round, he did shoot a score of 95 at Warburton Golf course in 2009, however the Warby course is a par 69. He also scored a 96 this year at Spring park which is a par 66. It should be noted that his score at Yarrambat Park was 12 shots better than Tony's career average.



The fine jar will receive a major boost this month as the coffers will be boosted by all of the no-show beer wenches. On numerous occasions there was a miscommunication on who's ball was whose.

In the end Tom went to extreme measures to make sure John was only ever playing with his own balls, and it seemed to work.



What Is a 'Wrong Ball,' and What's the Penalty for Playing One?

You and your buddy tee off on a [hole](#) and both hit into the [rough](#). You reach the golf balls first and play your [stroke](#). But when your buddy checks out the other ball, he discovers some bad news: You accidentally hit *his* golf ball. You played the wrong ball. Whoops.

What's the penalty? First, let's define "wrong ball."

'Wrong Ball' Definition in the Rules of Golf

So what, exactly, is a wrong ball in golf? This is the official definition of the term as it appears in [The Rules of Golf](#), written and maintained by the USGA and R&A:

A "wrong ball" is any ball other than the player's:

So, basically, before you play any stroke, *make sure the ball you are about to hit is yours!* Duh! This is why the Rules of Golf also state that it is every golfer's obligation to write or draw onto the golf balls they are using [some kind of identifying mark](#). That way if you and your buddy (or fellow-competitor or opponent) are using the same make and model of golf ball, you'll be able to tell them apart.

Still, mistakes do sometimes happen. Maybe your ball is in a spot that makes seeing the identification mark you put on it difficult; maybe you're just rushed and assuming a ball is yours.

If this occurs during a round then according to the rules of golf a two-stroke penalty is issued in [stroke play](#).

In stroke play, the offender must go back and replay any strokes with the correct ball. Failure to correct the mistake before teeing off on the following hole can result in disqualification.

The player whose ball was incorrectly played by a competitor or partner should drop a ball as close to the original spot as can be determined.

Ben Nichols also managed to commit this heinous crime on Sunday so please remember to mark your golf ball so you know which one is yours. Saying your ball is white with dimples is a good generalization to make it easier to claim any ball, however it is not really detailed enough. Remember also that the Sunday Leave Pass logo doesn't really cut the odds of confusion down either, as there is a good chance there is five or six of them going around the course at the same time.



While we are handing out advise it might be worth mentioning, that it is always a good idea to either put the brakes on your three-wheel golf buggy or at least point it parallel to the slope of the land when you are walking away from it. This was the final outcome of Shane Cummings golf buggy after it took off down the hill while he was putting on the 4th green. Luckily for Cider it only rolled about a Stu Coops drive from where it was meant to be and even more importantly the wheels didn't fall off. Shane was still able to continue his round and he carded the lowest gross score for the day. Shane had 78 off the stick and finished the afternoon in second place.

Congratulations to Tony MacIsaac on winning his first ever monthly title. To all of the doubters, bad luck. We knew he had it in him we just weren't sure if it was going to be this side of 2050. Well played Tony, you have booked a seat in the champion of champions challenge at Howlong, now wouldn't that be ironic if he ended up taking home that crown.

There were some very impressive scores at Yarrambat. Shane Cumming fell on the wrong side of the count back with Nett 66, Newell had started counting his chickens very early on with his score of 68, although third place and a couple of \$100 SOGO dollars will be a fair consolation prize. Mal Griffiths also scored well, he went home with a guaranteed 69 on the cards and Todd and Leigh both scored under their handicaps to finish in the top 5 with a score of Nett 70.

For the benefit of the newcomers or the uneducated we thought it would be a good opportunity to go through the player rankings and point scoring system again.

Once all of the players are ranked then the Seasons Championship points are allocated according to the position in the field. The player in 1st place gets 15 points, 2nd place 14 points, 3rd place 13 points, etc. etc. Any player who completes the round however finishes ranked outside the top 14 and is placed between 15th spot to BeerWench then they are all allocated 1 championship point for attending. The player with the most points at the end of the year is crowned the Points champion irrespective of how many rounds a person has played. If one person plays 13 rounds for the year and the person in 2nd place has only played 10 rounds but is close to the same score, then that is bad luck to the person in 2nd place. All players are invited to play the entire fixture. We reward participation rather than perfection and performance so if you play more often you will end up with more points.

Sunday Leave Pass competitions are run using Stroke, so you need to count every shot that you play, and you need to finish every hole. Each players Nett total score is then calculated by deducting the players handicap from the Gross score. If a player doesn't have an official Sunday Leave Pass handicap, then a temporary played to handicap is allocated on the day using the Callaway handicapping system.

All of our members are now on official handicaps.

For those people interested in the mechanics of the handicapping system it can be best explained as the following.

How to calculate a GA Handicap

To calculate a player's GA Handicap:

- you must firstly identify the player's most recent 20 scores,
- you then determine the 'Played To' value for each of these scores,
- you average the best 8 'Played To' values,
- and finally you multiply this average by 0.93. The resultant figure (to one decimal place) is the player's GA Handicap.

* If a player's handicap record contains a lesser number than 20 scores, the number of scores used to calculate the player's handicap is as listed in the table below.

* There is no requirement for a player's most recent 20 scores to have been returned within a specific timeframe. For example, the most recent 20 scores may span a period of three years or they may span a period of three months.

* Once a player's handicap record contains 20 scores, the next score they return will result in the oldest of the existing 20 scores being removed (to be replaced by the new score).

STEP 1 – Use the table below to determine the number of scores to be included in the GA Handicap calculation:

Number of Scores in Player's Handicap Record Scores to be Used in the Calculation

5 to 6	Best/Lowest 1
7 or 8	Best/Lowest 2
9 or 10	Best/Lowest 3
11 or 12	Best/Lowest 4
13 or 14	Best/Lowest 5
15 or 16	Best/Lowest 6
17 or 18	Best/Lowest 7
19 or 20	Best/Lowest 8

Note: When the handicap record contains more than 20 scores, the GA Handicap calculation uses the best 8 of the player's most recent 20 scores.
