

Yarrambat Golf Course Results August

After working tirelessly since March 2004, with more than 105 rounds of golf under my belt it is with heavy heart that I tender my resignation from chief organizer of the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club. Congratulation to SOS who actually masterminded the coup and evidently he has now publically nominated himself to stand as my successor going forward. Apparently in my absence SOS sealed my fate be delivering a faultless event and produced a powerful speech and a golf ball presentation so captivating that it was worthy of a standing ovation. Peter had out muscled Mick Harper and Gerard MacIsaac to get his name on the marker so he watched back anxiously as Steve O'Sullivan and Big Ball Breasley made their best efforts to reign in his drive. Once that group of big hitters failed to beat his marker it was expected that Peter would putt out, move on and play down the next hole. Not so, Peter sat at the back of the green and watched on as the following group teed off. It

As the year drags on our scores seem to be getting worse. This month no players were within reach of playing close to their handicap. Big Mick was the best of a bad batch. He won on a count back with a Nett score of 76. Tony Grasso Junior was the recipient of 14 championship points for his second place finish but he will be having nightmares about each of the 12x three putt greens which any one of them can be credited to costing him a first place finish.

Carl Schulze made the trip all the way down from Bright worth his while. As he does every time he plays with the Sunday Leave Pass Social Club, Carl finished in the top three and was also tied with Mick Harper but lost on a countback having scored less stableford points than Tony Junior and Mick on the back nine.

Gerard MacIsaac has extended his lead at the top of the Seasons Championship Points tally with a fourth place finish and with Greg Breasley posting disappointing scores over the last couple of months it has opened up the 2nd spot for Stu Coops who finished in 6th place this month albeit one day later than the rest of the field.

Despite not being able to talk, walk or remain focused on the single golf ball spinning around in front of him, Brendan Seagrave might get a shock to discover he finished the day in fifth spot. It could be an achievement worthy of a celebratory drink except that from the stories I have heard about how hung-over and green he was looking on Sunday morning there is a good chance that he will be off the booze for a few weeks at least.
