Yarrambat Golf Course Results

October

Yarrambat has proven itself to be a difficult scoring course over the years gone by, this month however despite slow, inconsistent recently cored greens, and long rough that made looking for your ball near impossible, the field as a whole have excelled in near perfect golfing weather conditions and produced some brilliant golf scores.

To put it in perspective the handicapper has savaged the group slashing a record 20 shots from this month's playing handicaps. Of the 22 players who made the journey out to Yan Yean, only slinky was given a fraction of a shot back and of the rest of the golfers at Yarrambat only Douggo, Jamie, Stu Coops and Big Breasley were left unadulterated. The players who suffered the most were Leigh MacIsaac (Nett 61) who carded a sub 90 round and was docked of 6.4 shots. Larry Campbell has been switched across from the old handicapping system to the slope system and in the process lost 5 shots. Ron Parsons continues his run personal improvement and great form. Ron started the year playing off a handicap of 31.7 and after being skinned of another 1.8 shots this month his handicap has dropped to 28.1.

Ron is actually only 8 points behind the points championship leader and currently in 3rd place despite playing three less games for the season.

Although there was a chorus of complaints about the condition of the greens they had very little impact on the golf. In fact it could be argued that there was a marked improvement. Glen Douglas who averages more than 33 putts per round, started the day with 5 one putts in a row, Douggo drained a long one putt on the 18th hole to complete the day as the putting champ with just 27 putts for the entire round. SOS, Grumpy and Ron all had better than average rounds with the flat stick and consequently the all featured well at the pointy end of the leaderboard.

Greg Breasley on the other hand was not quite as adept with the putter. Greg amassed a staggering total of 10x three putt greens giving him a total of 45 putts for the day. Big Ball Breasley even three putted the 16th hole despite being given the prize for the NTP when he hit his shot to inside 6 feet from the cup. Greg's birdie attempt fell 3 feet short and his next stroke missed the cup entirely. After a putting performance that bad we are starting to wonder whether Greg has an affinity for wearing yellow, especially since he wore the Three Putt Monkey vest for 15 of the 18 holes he was out on the golf course.

SOS and Barry both contributed to reducing their career putting average by scoring chip ins. SOS made a No Putt birdie on the 5th hole and Barry negotiated the steep bank on the right hand side of the par 5 seventh hole to steer his ball into the hole without pulling the putter out of his golf bag.

It was great to have a few cameo appearances, from the Sunday Leave Pass group. Steve Powne made a rare appearance for 2015 and also Jamie Brunton who is from the original core group of golf tragic's who founded the Sunday Leave Pass Group back in 2004. Jamie quickly got in the spirit and by the third hole he had three putted, had an air-swing, hit a shank and was long on his way to donning the beer wench vest after a disappointing round of 110. Jamie had some flashes of brilliance with some very impressive ball striking with the three wood off the tee.

Unfortunately his round will be remembered more so for his drive on the tenth hole when he failed to hit his ball past the men's tees. With the trailing wind, elevated tee and wide open fairway Jamie elected to throw his shoulders into his drive. Unfortunately he just nicked the top of the ball, it dove straight into the ground, bounced backwards behind him and then spun forward coming to rest just inches in front of where he stood in a perfect follow through position. Incredibly Jamie avoided a \$5 fine for failing to hit the ball past the ladies tees because for some strange reason the squatters tees were actually positioned further back than the men's tees on the tenth hole. The karma gods got him in the end since on the very next hole Jamie hit the ball 40 meters but his drive fell short of the ladies tee's. If that wasn't demoralizing enough later in the day experienced the worst moment of his golfing career. That happened on the 16th hole when he once again failed to hit his 5 iron past the ladies tee on the downhill par three hole and was then ridiculed by Newell who despite being in a different playing group followed him down the fairway to his next shot snickering as he went just to make sure Jamie got passed the red tees with his next shot.

The Karma gods were out with a vengeance and Newell's round quickly unraveled thereafter. Along with his score of 110 and the single participation point went any Cinderella story of him getting to the top of the points leaderboard. So determined was Newell that he was going to be a competitive force in the Sunday Leave Pass Points championship at the end of 2015 that Highway had already started his practice rounds at Kingston Links just to make sure he had an advantage over his closest rivals.

Col Ewart was in control of the Karma Gods and he directed the universal wrath on a social golfer who had the cheek to laugh at a shot of Greg Breasleys that didn't go according to plan. Col said to the total stranger in no uncertain terms "you should not laugh at another person's misfortune or Karma will come back to bite you." The poor fella's next shot was a shank that disappeared into the water on the fairway beside him and Col could be heard yelling back down the fairway "I told ya so, you wanker."

Tony Grasso claimed the longest drive prize for his smashing drive down the first hole, whereas his namesake Tony MacIsaac narrowly escaped a \$5 fine when his embarrassing attempt to launch his ball trickled onto the cart path beside the tee and then dribbled along the concrete roadway with just enough momentum fueled by the downhill gradient to come to rest only inches in front of the ladies tees. So slowly was Tony's golf balls journey that it was overtaken by a snail as it trundled along the cart path. Tony Mac had a knack of using outside influences during his round. On the 5th hole he took a lucky bounce off a sprinkler head to move his ball onto the fringe of the green. On the fifteenth hole Tony crushed a three wood which would have almost landed on the green to set up for a birdie had it not hit the 150 marker and ricocheted back over his shoulder and disappeared into the lake behind him.

Tony wasn't the only person to lose a stroke to the water gods. Balls were being lost all over the golf course, Jamie hit two in a row into the lake on the 13th, Tony Mac and Big Ball Breasley each made donations to the lake on the 8th hole and slinky was seen playing his ninth shot off the tee on the 12th after he failed to negotiate the creek four times in a row. To his credit slinky finally made a 1 putt 12 on the difficult par three. Slinky actually had run out of golf balls in his bag and only completed his round after borrowing half a dozen balls off Stu Coops to see him through to the end of the round. Stu Coops could not have had many balls left in his bag himself, given he dumped balls on the 5th, 13th and 15th holes.

Jamie Brunton also dumped a ball into the pond with his drive on the last hole. He took a drop just in front of the lake and as he stood over his next shot he asked his playing partner what he could do to block the water out of his mind. Stu said to him don't worry about the water, it isn't even there but you should wait till they clear the green cos you don't want to hit up on them while they are putting. Jamie smashed his 3 wood 220 meters straight up the hill and was quickly abused for not calling fore when his ball rolled up and onto the green just as Greg Breasley stood over his 45th putt for the day to claim the yellow vest for the tenth time.

Douggo also smashed a fairway wood over the heads of Grumpy, Mick and Leigh using the excuse that he had called fore to justify the fact that it wasn't his fault that he had nearly killed them.

Leigh was in a world of his own and so he didn't even notice the golf ball passing between him and the pearly gates. Inspired by some power hitting and good golf by Mick, Brendan and Nigel, Leigh was determined to score well and he took some advise from Newell and had several practice rounds during the week to ensure the Beer wench vest would not be on his shoulders two months in a row. The pink vest looked out of place on Leigh as he tore the course apart, he hit a career best 89 off the stick Nett 61bettering his previous best by 9 shots and making a 28 shot improvement on his round at Ringwood.

Leigh turned up to golf in his skater shoes and everyone thought he had just forgotten to pack the golf spikes, but Leigh retorted "He had played two good rounds in those shoes during the week" so he wasn't going to change the winning combination. The fact that he hadn't changed his socks, jocks or taken a bath since Wednesday was a bit on the nose but it worked as his score of 89 was good enough to elevate him from the S#!7 House to the penthouse in just one month.

Leigh just beat Ron Parsons on a countback. Both players finished with the same Nett score however Leigh had 24 stableford points on the back nine whereas Ron had 23 points, therefore giving Leigh the title and 15 championship points. Ron has been the most consistent player in 2015, he has missed 3 rounds this year yet is only a top 10 finish behind Dale and Rick who are starting to get nervous as Ron has eluded to the fact that he may be a very late addition to the convoy to Rich River in December.

Grumpy has once again found his happy place, 6 months ago he was floundering on the course but suddenly he is back into championship winning form and the bookies are rating him as the outsider who might just run down the lead pack on the home straight. Nigel Stone found the conditions at Yarrambat to his liking. Nigel played a faultless round and his score of 87 resulted in him placing in 4th position.

Tony Mac played admirably hitting an even century for the day. Rick pulled back a point on championship leader Dale with his score of 101. Rick had a putt for Par on the last hole to break 100 but he got so excited that he not only missed the par putt but he also missed the one coming back and finished on a sour note what was otherwise a very good day on the golf course.

Dale and Rick are continuing to hang around at the top end of the points distribution and it appears as though the 2015 championship will come out of Dale, Rick, Brendan, Ron or Mick. With a very tough course Kingston Links to come there may still be a bit of movement at the top of the points tally, a good round from one of the guys and a bad one from one of the others and the who order of merit may quickly be transformed.

REMINDER HOW 3 PUTT MONKEY GAME WORKS

*As part of the putting competition this year, as a brainchild suggestion from Paul Blizzard we have introduced the Three Putt Monkey game. At the start of each round every group will be given a flouro yellow 3 Putt Monkey vest and whenever a person has a <u>3 putt or worse</u> that player must put on the 3 Putt Monkey Vest and wear it until another player in the group has a <u>3 putt or more</u>. The player wearing the 3 putt Monkey vest at the completion of the 18th hole will be required to chip in an additional \$2 into the fine jar. If multiple players have a <u>3 putt or worse</u> the player who was last into the hole wins the vest irrespective of whether the other player before them had a 3 putt, four putt or even a seven putt. The furthest player from the hole should always putt first on the green and that player is deemed as in control and therefore has the option of marking their ball if they miss the putt or putting out. If they chose to putt out and then the following person three putts then the last person to putt out gets the vest.

HANDICAPS

The changes to player's handicaps are as follows: **BOLD RED NUMBERS-** refer to players whose handicap has gone out **BOLD GREEN NUMBERS-** refer to players whose handicap has come in **BOLD BLACK NUMBERS-** refer to players whose handicap has remained unchanged NON BOLD NUMBERS- refer to players who didn't play this month so handicap has not changed
